Goal 1: All children ready for school



Risk = Risk of not meeting end of year benchmark






Nonsense Words English % Low Risk




Goal 2: Close the Achievement Gap

The reading gap between Black and White students will decrease by 2% from Spring 2024 to Spring 2025 as measured by MCA/MTAS reading proficiency (grades 3-11).

The math gap will decrease by 2% as measured by MCA/MTAS math proficiency.








4-year graduation rate




Goal 5: Prepare Students for Lifelong Learning

The percentage of SLP HS students enrolling in career/college readiness programs will increase by 2% from SY24 to SY25




PSEO Enrollments by Semester/Year

Expectations Moving Forward

- ☐ Continue to Strengthen Core Tier I instruction
 - Ensuring guaranteed viable curriculum across elementary sites in SLP
 - ☐ Engaging robust Tier 1 instruction for EACH student
 - ☐ Time dedicated for collaborative planning across grade level teams
- ☐ Focused Implementation of Core Literacy Curriculum at elementary.
 - "Just in Time" Professional Development across the year for K-5 teachers (approximately every 6-8 weeks)
 - ☐ Implementation Tools developed to support shared accountability
 - Instructional Coaching at each elementary site
- Develop a Student Centered Instructional Coaching Model
 - Instructional coaches in each school site to partner with administrators and teachers in actionalizing the strategic plan
 - ☐ Establish student centered, data informed, collaborative coaching cycles
 - ☐ Connect PD and student learning through coaching cycles .
