


Benefits of Participation in Promontory Commerce Center (PCC) CRA


Participation in the Promontory Commerce Center CRA presents a unique opportunity for a public/private partnership that is estimated to generate ~\$14.9M of new tax revenue to the Weber County School District over a 25-year period.

Tax Revenue to Weber School District over 25-Year CRA



New tax revenue will be created through the development of PCC, a 355-acre commerce center in West Weber. This project requires ~\$103M of public infrastructure improvements to proceed. Developer (BlackPine) has agreed to pay for 80% of the public infrastructure improvements. The CRA would fund the remaining ~20% through a \$20.8M bond.





In total, PCC will generate ~\$126.7M in new tax revenue over the 25-year period. Approximately 80% of the new tax revenue is required by the CRA to meet State/County requirements and pay the debt service for the \$20.8M public infrastructure bond. The remaining tax increment will benefit the taxing entities directly, with Weber School District collecting an estimated \$14.9M in new tax revenue over the 25-year life of the CRA.

Through partnership from the Districts at this level, the required public infrastructure can be funded and PCC can be developed resulting in substantial new tax revenue generation for the Districts. Additional economic benefits of this partnership to the School District are highlighted below:
