TMS School Report Card

Recently the school and district report cards have been made public. As a district, Tomahawk received the "Exceeds Expectations" mark. As a school, TMS received the "Meets Expectations" mark. TMS was less than a point away from the "Exceeding Expectations" ranking, and achieved its highest overall score since the school report card was created. Scores at the school level are based on student performance on the Forward Exam taken last spring, attendance data, test participation, and other factors.

TMS Focus On Keeping Things Positive

At TMS we are continually trying to build positive relationships with students and encourage them to make positive choices. Students can be rewarded for their academic achievement, attendance, hard work ethic, and/or citizenship.

For academics, students can be placed on the honor roll each quarter. There are different levels on the honor roll dependent on the student's Grade Point Average or GPA. The three levels are Platinum, Gold, and Silver. For attendance, the three levels are Perfect,



Stellar, and Commendable. Students can also earn the Principal's Award for demonstrating outstanding citizenship, effort, or leadership. One girl and one boy from each grade is selected for the Principal's Award each quarter. Students who may not have made the honor roll, but who have made significant growth in their academics or behavior can also receive the Hatchet Award (formerly the Principle's Award), for their efforts.

Students who achieve the honor roll, attendance recognition, the Principal's Award or the Hatchet Award in any quarter are recognized as part of an all school Renaissance Rally Assembly. All students can attend the assembly. After the assembly, those students who have earned the awards participate in a choice of activity. Those who are not eligible work on missing work, organize their lockers, read silently, or work on Front Row. It is hoped those students will see the value in hard work and making good choices so they will

be able to participate in the incentive next quarter.

Another way we encourage positive choices is through our PBIS recognition through Hatchet Cash. Students can earn Hatchet Cash for making positive choices, helping others, or doing "the right thing." Ultimately we want students do things not for the reward, but because it's just the right thing to do. We have weekly drawings from the Hatchet Cash for prizes. We also have grade level challenges to focus on positive behaviors throughout the school building. Each grade also has a grade level incentive students can work for weekly. It is hoped that focusing on the positive will improve school climate.
