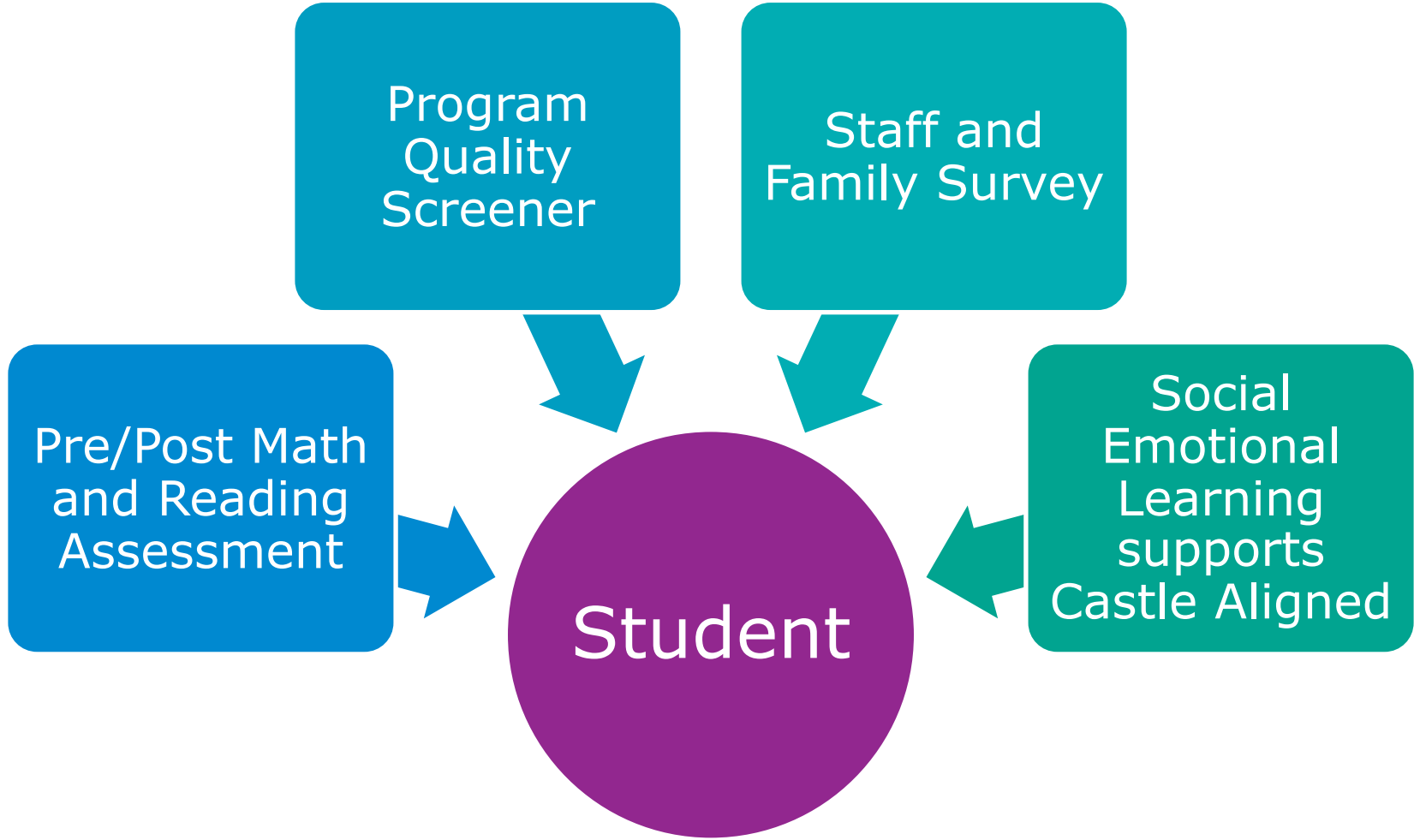

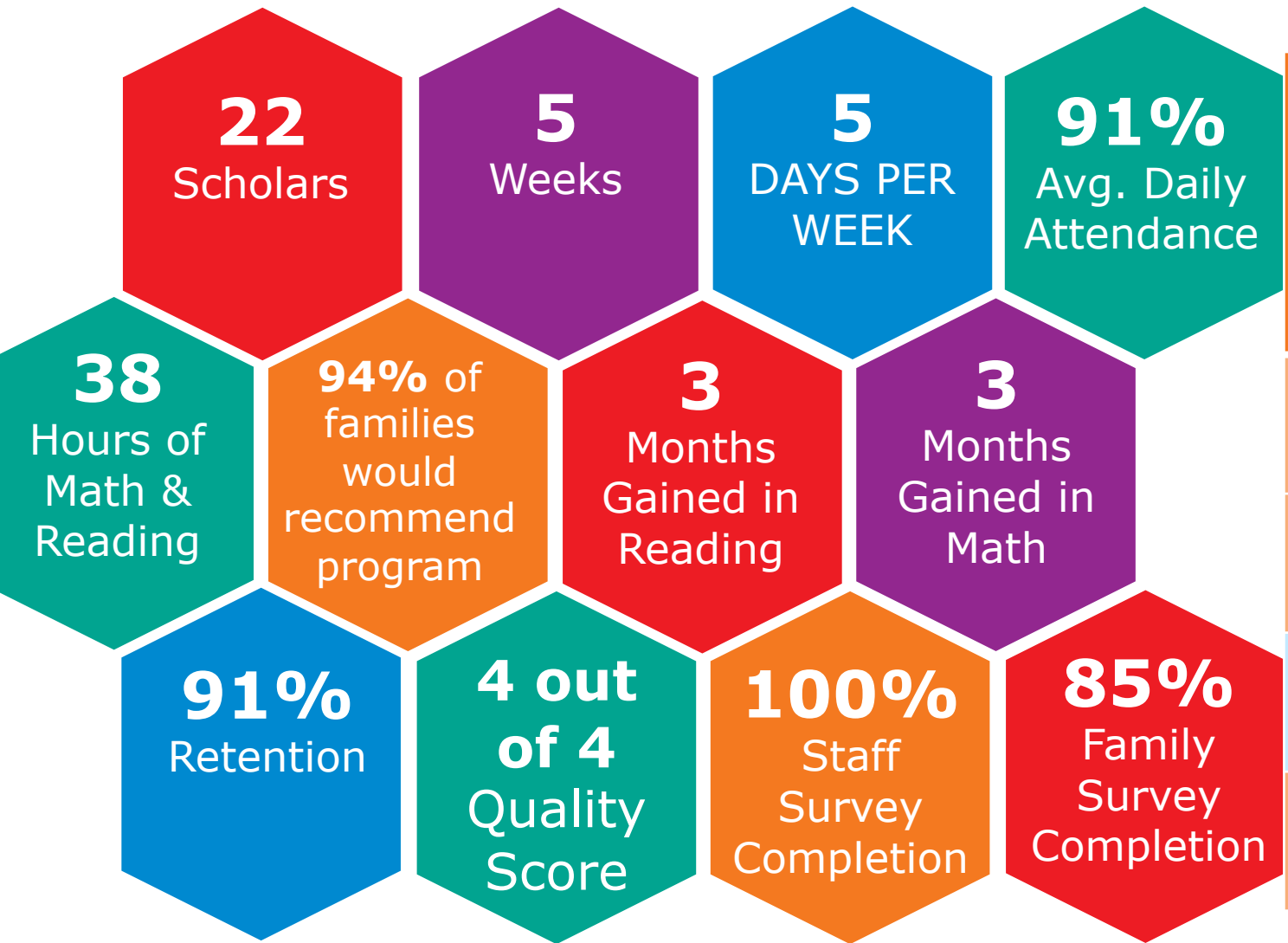

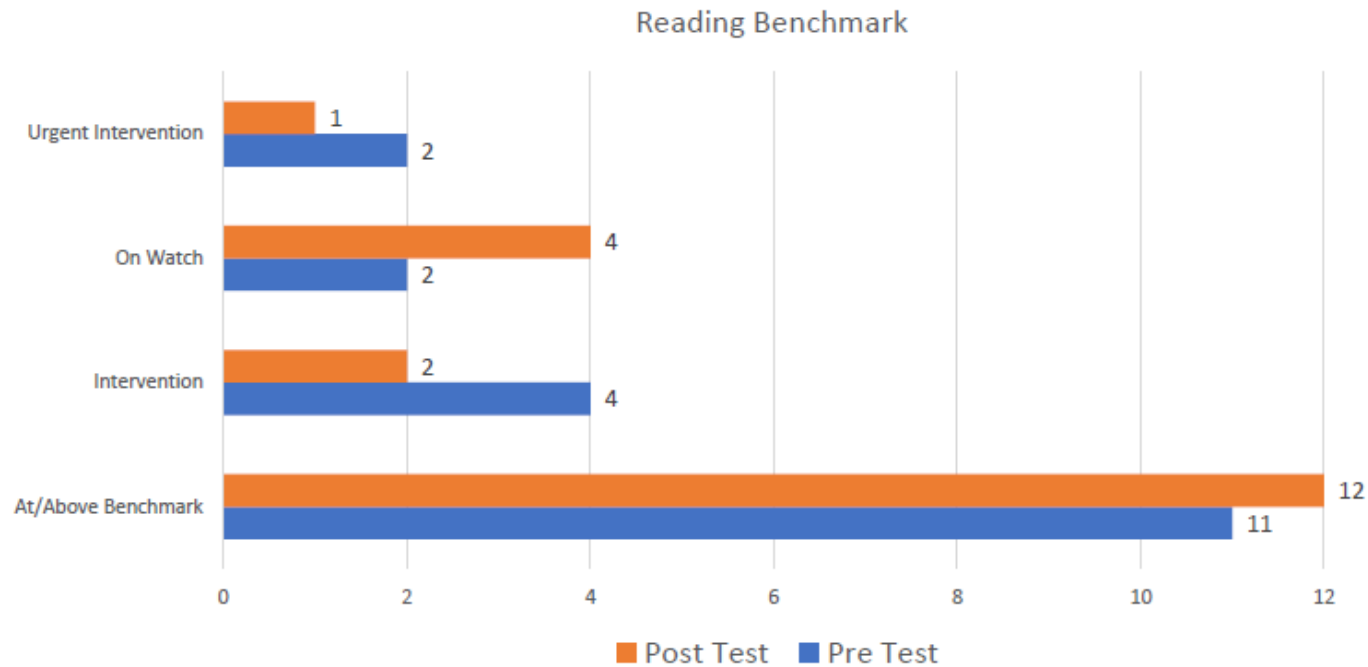


## D90 SCHOLARS SOCIAL EMOTIONAL FAMILY FEEDBACK

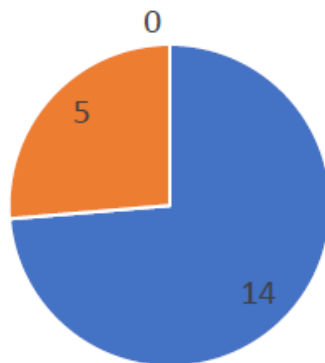
Family Survey – SEL Components	2023	2022

(considered area of strength if scored 80% or higher)**

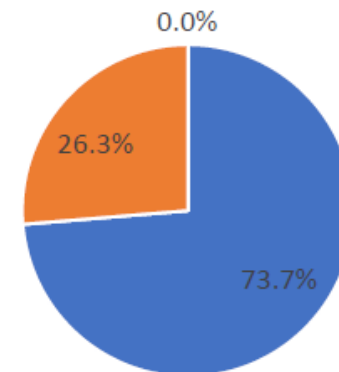
# INDIVIDUAL READING RESULTS



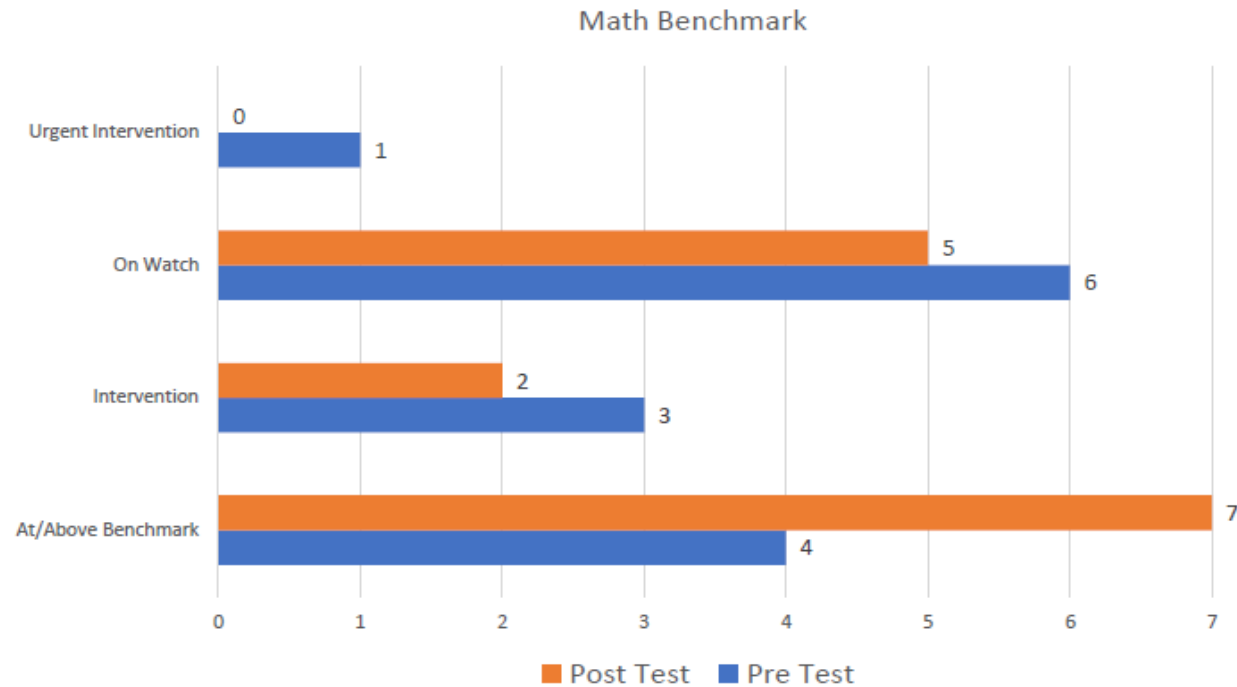
Number of Students Reading from Test 1 to Test 2



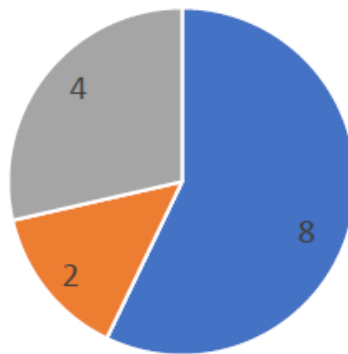
Percentage of Students Reading from Test 1 to Test 2



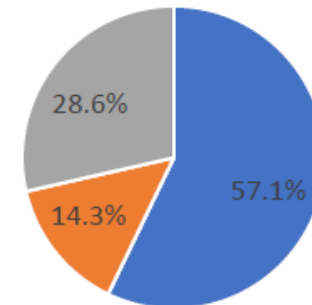
# INDIVIDUAL MATH RESULTS
