Region V Honor Music Festival was hosted by Wrangell High School October 26 - 28. This is a fantastic educational and performance opportunity for our students and all reported having a great time. Thank you to Rachael Balcom for coordinating auditions and ensuring our student musicians were prepared!

Craig hosted the South Seed Volleyball Tournament November 6-8. Eight teams competed with a total of approximately 70 athletes. It was a lot of volleyball! Thank you Tina Steffen for your work coordinating the tournament and monitoring the proceedings over the three days. The weather was not cooperative for several of our teams and Tina reworked the schedule 4 times! But the tournament went smoothly — visitors always complement CHS for our hospitality and organization.

CHS hosted the 41st Elder Luncheon Tuesday, November 25. Each year students and staff prepare a feast for the elders of our island.
