- Shorewood High School is made up of an ethnically diverse population with a make-up of:
 - □ 0.5% American Indian, 5.8% Asian, 16.6% Black, Hispanic 4.7%, and 69.4% White.
- Of the 634 students enrolled at SHS:
 - □ 17.4% were economically disadvantaged and 82.6% were not economically disadvantaged or had no data.
 - □ 12.9% of the total student population were reported as having a disability.






Average Composite Score 4 Years







