For seniors who are eligible to graduate and are assigned to a DAEP at the time of graduation, the last day of placement in the DAEP shall be the last instructional school day, and the student shall be allowed to participate in the graduation ceremony and related graduation activities unless otherwise specified in the DAEP placement order.

GRADUATION PARTICIPATION



Addition to Mistreatment of Others

Students will not engage in any behavior that is motivated by antisemitism.

ANTISEMITISM PROHIBITED



Elementary students shall not bring or use a personal communication device, including a cell phone, or any other electronic device not issued by the school while at school during the school day.

Secondary students shall not use a personal communications device, including a cell phone, smart watch, tablet, or other electronic device on school property during the school day and shall store the device in accordance with the method of storage established by the district.

PERSONAL COMMUNICATION DEVICES

Damaged pouch or immediate consequence	 Parent/guardian contacted. After-school or lunch detention within five school days. If the pouch must be replaced, a reimbursement fee as determined by Administrative Procedures III-A Exhibit A, will be issued. Repeated violations of this nature may result in further disciplinary consequences.
1 st Offense	 Phone is confiscated and kept in a campus-designated location for the day. Offense noted on referral with cell phone violation action code 201. Parent/guardian contacted. Student assigned one day of after-school or lunch detention. Student will pick up the phone at the end of the day.
2 nd Offense	 Phone is confiscated and kept in a campus-designated location for the day. Offense noted on referral with SERIOUS cell phone violation action code 198. Parent/Guardian contacted. Parent/Guardian must pick up cell phone during school hours (no students will be allowed to retrieve their phone). In-person meeting scheduled with parent/guardian. Student assigned minimum of one day of In School Suspension (ISS). Student will be placed on Campus Probation for 45 days
3 rd Offense	 Phone is confiscated and kept in a campus-designated location for the day. Offense noted on referral with SERIOUS cell phone violation action code 198. Violation of Campus Probation noted in the discipline referral notes. Parent/Guardian contacted. Parent/Guardian must pick up cell phone during school hours (no students will be allowed to retrieve their phone). Student assigned three days of In School Suspension (ISS). Campus-Level Hearing (CLH) with a possible placement in the District Alternative Education Program (DAEP).

Students shall not prop open exterior doors by any means or open any exterior door for any other student, staff member or visitor unless assisting campus faculty/staff by request.

PROPPING OR OPENING DOORS



Option A allowing the use of the behavioral agreement for the student's first assignment to DAEP of the school year, for a possible reduction in assignment of up to 10 % of the originally assigned days

Option B stating the district has not adopted a policy to allow for the behavioral agreement

The behavioral agreement will specify the responsibilities of the student and parent/guardian. If followed, the agreement may result in a reduced disciplinary placement period (up to 10 percent of the original assignment), as outlined in the agreement. Reduction in the disciplinary placement period does not entitle the student to a different disciplinary placement. The decision to reduce, revoke or amend the disciplinary placement period is at the sole discretion of the school administration. Compliance with the agreement is required for the reduction to remain valid. Note: Behavioral agreements are only offered for initial DAEP placements and are not available for repeated placements within the same school year.

The district has not adopted a policy for parental involvement in school disciplinary placements under Education Code 37.0014.

Students are required to wear a seat belt if the bus is equipped with seat belts.

SEAT BELT REQUIREMENTS ON BUS



A teacher may initiate a formal removal from class if:

A student's behavior repeatedly interferes with the teacher's ability to teach the class or with other students' ability to learn.

A student demonstrates behavior that is unruly, disruptive, or abusive toward the teacher, another adult, or another student in the classroom.

STUDENT REMOVAL BY TEACHER



Within three school days of the formal removal, the CBC or appropriate administrator shall schedule a conference with the student's parent, the student, the teacher who removed the student from class, and any other appropriate administrator. The teacher has the option to provide input for the meeting through a written statement.

STUDENT REMOVAL BY TEACHER



A student who has been formally removed by a teacher for any other conduct may not be returned to the teacher's class without the teacher's written consent unless the placement review committee determines that the teacher's class is the best or only alternative available. Not later than the third class day after the student was removed from class, a conference in which the teacher was provided an opportunity to participate has been held. The student may not be returned to the teacher's class unless the teacher provides written consent for the student's return or a return to class plan has been prepared for that student.

STUDENT RETURN TO CLASS



Members of the committee who will review a student's return to class shall be appointed by the principal or designee and include:

- 1. Two teachers to serve as members and
- 2. One member from the administrative staff of the campus.

Note: The teacher refusing to readmit the student may not serve on the committee.

STUDENT RETURN TO CLASS PLAN



A student may appeal the teacher's removal of the student from class to the school's placement review committee or the campus's threat assessment and safe and supportive school team, in accordance with a district policy providing for such an appeal to be made to this team

STUDENT APPEAL FOR REMOVAL



A student below grade 3 or a student who is homeless shall not be placed in out-of-school suspension unless, while on school property or while attending a school-sponsored or school-related activity on or off school property, the student engages in:

- Conduct that threatens the immediate health and safety of other students in the classroom; or
- Documented conduct that results in repeated or significant disruption to the classroom

OSS FOR STUDENTS BELOW GRADE 3



A student may be assigned in-school-suspension (ISS) for repeated and significant classroom disruption or if the student threatens the immediate health and safety of others. A placement review will occur every 10 days of ISS assigned to determine if continued in-school suspension is appropriate. Students will continue to receive behavioral support services and comparable educational services as the student would receive in the classroom.

ISS LENGTH OF ASSIGNMENT



In deciding whether to place a student in DAEP, regardless of whether the action is mandatory or discretionary, the campus administrator or designee shall serve as hearing officer.

Virtual Expulsion Program

In some circumstances, a student may be placed in a virtual expulsion program.

- The school will ensure students in the program have the necessary technology and internet and will provide it if needed.
- The virtual program will, as much as possible, meet the same requirements as an in-person disciplinary alternative education program (DAEP).
- The student's placement will be reviewed every 45 school days.
- If an in-person spot becomes available at the JJAEP, the school should plan the student's return to in-person learning.
- If continued virtual placement is appropriate, the school will document the decision.

VIRTUAL EDUCATION FOR EXPELLED STUDENTS



Consideration of Virtual Education as Alternative to Expulsion

Before a school district may expel a student, the district must consider the appropriateness and feasibility of, as an alternative to expulsion, enrolling the student in a full-time hybrid program, full-time virtual program, full-time hybrid campus, or full-time virtual campus. This requirement does not apply to a student expelled under Education Code 37.0081 or 37.007(a), (d), or(e).

VIRTUAL EDUCATION FOR EXPELLED STUDENTS



Killeen ISD requires students to use clear or mesh backpacks. Students participating in an extracurricular activity are permitted to carry non-transparent bags to store items pertaining to their particular activity (i.e. band, athletics, etc.). Upon entry into the school, all extracurricular activity bags must be stored in lockers or designated areas. All bags are subject to search. Additionally, the maximum size for non-transparent bags that students will be permitted to carry during the school day, such as lunch boxes/kits, pencil bags, and purses, will be 6" x 9".
