

Community Education

- Little League has been running since April 28th. There are over 100 kids in grades three through six participating. I would like to thank all of the coaching volunteers for the countless hours spent educating our students. Each volunteer coach has participated in three hours of National Alliance for Youth Sports training and is doing a fantastic job with our kids. Lower Division games started on Monday, May 12th, and the Upper Division will start on May 20th, and both will run through the end of June. If you are interested in coming out and watching a game, they are on Monday and Thursday nights, with the lower-division playing at 5:15 pm and the upper-division playing at 6:35.

Federal Programs

- On Tuesday, June 11th, we will be holding a data and evaluation meeting to plan next year's goals and programming for our Title Program. This plan will include intervention strategies, curriculum needs, and professional development plans to help bolster our students' learning.
- The District Office and I have been working on the budgets for all of our Federal Programs. This is to ensure that we have adequate funding for the staff and program needs that we have in place. This is the first step in the long process of completing the Title 1 and 2, Achievement, Integration, and Title III (ESL) Grants.
