TEF awards a combination of merit-based and need based scholarships.

In 2025, TEF awarded \$134,150 in scholarship.

Nine new scholarships were added this past year.















TEF sells premium parking spots for the Wildcat home football games. 72 spots are reserved for Century Club parking. This year, this fundraiser brought in \$10,650.
