

School Goals & Plans 2024-2025

Learning Goals

- 1. By May 30, 2025, students of Duchesne High School will increase the percentage of students proficient in ELA (English Language Arts), Math, and Science on state year end assessments by 2% from the previous year. Additionally, we will improve the average ACT composite score by 2 points. We will have a graduation rate of 95% or higher.
- 2. Teachers will increase student engagement. Each teacher will work towards an Opportunity to Respond (OTR) rate of 3.0 and a student participation rate of 1.5

Learning Action Plans

Purchase chromebooks, carts, and conduct additional training for teachers to help them utilize the technology for student learning.

Land Trust Money will be used to purchase materials and supplies so students can engage in hands-on learning experiences.

Additional Land Trust money will be used to pay for any DHS student to take the ACT one additional time.

Provide Before and after school tutoring for any math students needing additional assistance.

ELA (English Language Arts) teachers will use the STAR reading assessment as well as RISE and ASPIRE data to identify students who are below grade level in reading. Once identified, these students will be provided with targeted Tier II reading interventions.

Provide a personalized education for students by opening online options and credit recovery options so that each student will be enabled to graduate from high school. This will be throughout the 2024-25 school year. We will hire a part-time paraeducator to coordinate the online work of students. This paraeducator will work under the direction of the Principal and School Counselor.

Teachers will be provided with professional development opportunities to improve student engagement. Monthly faculty meetings led by the A2A team will

focus on student engagement strategies.
