Student Council

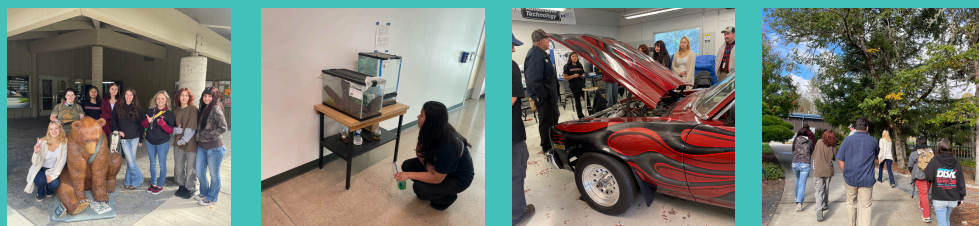
