


Capital City opened its doors to scholars in 2015. CCLCS currently serves 167 scholars in grades K - 5.










	Achievement 2017-2018	Achievement 2018-2019	Increase in Achievement
Reading	11.11%	20%	+8.89%
English	38.89%	49.47%	+10.58%
Science	13.89%	16.84%	+2.95%
Math	16.67%	28.42%	+11.75

- All content areas increased in achievement
 - More than 10% increase in English and Math
 - Nearly a 9% increase in Reading
 - 6.5 % increase in ELA (English, Writing, and Reading achievement)

- Capital City Lighthouse's four-year average for observed growth on the Northwest Evaluation Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) Assessment was 1.1 years.
- For two years, Capital City Lighthouse Charter School exceeded the 1.25 years of observed growth.
- In the third year, four of the eight grade level cohorts met or exceeded the 1.25 growth goal.
