He has an endorsement/approval for CVAE Building Maintenance and Plant Maintenance. Mr. Mayo works extremely well with students by instilling a confidence in each child that he works with. He participates in the Bee County Sherriff's Department Reserves Program..
- 2. Does the district or campus plan reflect the need for this waiver? If yes, what is the specific objective impacted by the waiver? Yes, the District Improvement Plan calls for educating students through Career and Technology. **District Goal:** Technology and real-world experiences will be integrated into instructional activities

District Objective: The campuses will incorporate workplace / employability skills in instructional activities to include understanding financial responsibility and working with team members. **District Activity:** Real world activities through career education

RULE §230.437	Issuance of Certificates Based on Examination

General provisions. A teacher who holds a valid provisional, professional, or standard classroom teaching certificate or a valid temporary classroom teaching certificate issued under the provisions of Subchapter O of this chapter (relating to Texas Educator Certificates Based on Certification and College Credentials from Other States or Territories of the United States), or Chapter 245 of this title (relating to Certification of Educators from Other Countries), and a bachelor's degree may qualify for an additional teaching field or certification to teach at another level by passing the appropriate certification examination(s) for that subject. The rule shall not be used to qualify a classroom teacher for:

(1) initial certification;

(2) career and technology certification based on skill and experience;

(3) another class of certificate, as listed in 19 TAC Chapter 232, Subchapter M, of this title (relating to Types and Classes of Certificates);

(4) certification for which no certification examination has been developed.

- 4. **Describe the plan to be implemented, if the waiver is granted.** This teacher, Mr. Chowan Mayo, Sr., will teach a program which is already in effect. Enrollment for this program is 140 students. The program has been extremely successful, and the district would like to continue providing this as a career option for the students.
- 5. How will granting this waiver help achieve the district or campus's objective? By receiving this waiver, Beeville ISD will be able to provide continued career training through criminal justice and promote life long learning for these students.

This program has a history of being extremely successful—winning many awards through competition. Students exiting this program have a sense of confidence and are exposed to a wide variety of careers in law enforcement.

- 6. Please explain how the school district or campus will evaluate the impact of the waiver towards meeting the district or campus's goal. Enrollment will remain around or above 140 students. The number of coherent sequence takers through the criminal justice program will increase by 2% annually. Students will be given an opportunity to enroll in the CTE criminal justice program beginning at the 8th grade year. The CTE program will continue to provide education to all students regardless of race, creed, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability.
