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Superior HealthPlan Partnership Agreement Children of Migrant Farmworker Outreach Process

This partnership agreement sets forth and outlines the understanding between **South San Antonio Independent School District** (“Agency”) and Superior HealthPlan, Inc. (“SHP”) as it relates to the process of ongoing identification and outreach to our members including Children of Migrant Farmworkers. “Migrant Farmworkers” will be defined as it is by the Texas Department of Health and Human Services.

Background

Migrant Farmworker families may face social, safety and healthcare obstacles such as transportation difficulties, social isolation, language and cultural barriers and other hazards associated with a migrative lifestyle. Superior and Agency intend to collaborate to identify opportunities for SHP to identify members and their children and provide them with information relating to the availability and provisions of healthcare benefits.

Purpose

The purpose of this partnership is to formalize clear guidelines for Agency and Superior’s collaborative relationship. Superior desires to develop a relationship based on the mutual interest of supporting a positive and healthier community. Maximizing these opportunities depends on activities that engages Agency and Superior staff, activities that inform or educate staff, or activities that facilitates the engagement of members of the migrant community with Superior personnel.

Activities and communication may include but not limited to:

- Phone calls
- Parent meetings/events
- Health fairs
- Staff meetings
- Community events
- Face to face meetings



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Reporting

Agency will share upcoming opportunities (activities stated above) for Superior staff to identify and perform outreach to Superior members including migrant farmworker members. Any reporting Superior is required to perform to the Texas Department of Health and Human Services will be solely at the discretion of Superior based on verified information and in

Duration

This agreement is at-will and may be modified by mutual written consent of authorized representatives from the Agency and SHP.

This agreement shall become effective from **09/01/2026** upon signature by the authorized representatives from the Agency and SHP and will remain in effect until modified or terminated by any one of the parties by mutual written consent. SHP will have a minimum of ten outreach opportunities in a one-year period with Agency. In the absence of mutual agreement by the authorized representatives from Agency and SHP, this MOU shall end on **08/31/2028**.
