The Minnesota READ (Reading to Ensure Academic Development) Act was passed and signed into law by Governor Tim Walz on May 24, 2023. The goal of this legislation is for every Minnesota child, including multilingual learners and students receiving special education services, to be reading at or above grade level.

Positive Environment: PBIS

- Our PBIS committee meets every month to frame our initiatives and make plans to make our school a positive place to be every day!
- We continue to recognize student gains through ROAR Bucks, prizes in the rolling ROAR Store, & coupons for special activities such as pizza, root beer float parties, and donuts with our SRO.
- This full scale effort involves ALL of our staff. Bus and Van Drivers were trained recently as well, and will receive ongoing training and supports for behavior and self regulation for students when riding school vehicles.

Positive Environment: Mental Health

- School linked mental health is going very strong with our partner, Bethany
 Cleary. She currently has a caseload of 40 students with a wait list.
- Students receive additional supports from our guidance counselor,
 - Hannah Feten and our ADSIS coordinator for SEL, Fealy through counseling and group lessons.
- Alicia and Bethany recently presented at the school--linked Behavioral Health Conference on healing partnerships. MDE holds this conference yearly.

Finance and Management

Student Activities:

 All student activities and supplementary activities to instruction are run through our own student fundraising account, which Alicia manages.

Finance / Instructional Spending:

- Usage reports are analyzed to determine the value ongoing technology programs and subscriptions. Usage and efficacy data drive Alicia's decisions. Program and classroom spending are tracked. Each teacher has a budget and a process for spending. Special education spending follows a separate approval process.
- **Staff Development:** Staff development requests flow through the Q Comp council or building principals to determine cost and benefit analysis.
