5. New Business

a. Stryker Badges

Stacy Knudson presented the Board with a brief description of the benefits of the Stryker Badges. These badges would be worn by all staff during their workday. It would eliminate communication gaps if staff were on the playground, down at the football field or off campus with their class at the public library. It would fulfill ODE's safety recommendations in case of an emergency or lockdown situation. Russ Ceperich spoke to his experience with them and reaffirmed the benefits. Jamie Olsen asked about applying for a grant to help offset the cost.

b. Secondary Grade Level Proposal

Stacy Knudson let the Board know that 6th grade is recognized as middle school class by ODE (Oregon Department of Education). With their age as well as participating in middle school sports and wanting to fit in with their peers, having them change classes throughout the day may help with some of the behavior issues.
