### 15 years ago... PING! was born

- Parents noticed that the children on stage at a band concert didn't reflect their school's diversity.
- They found that the cost of renting a band or orchestra instrument was a significant barrier for many families in the community.
- They believed in the power of a music education and wanted it to be available to all children.
- They joined with music teachers and approached the D97 board with an innovative concept to remove that barrier to access.



### **PING**!'s values and mission remain relevant

We believe that participation in the arts is an essential and fundamental part of a child's educational experience that should be available to all students, regardless of family income.


PING! opens the doors to music education by providing musical instruments and music enrichment opportunities to low income students in our community. We work in collaboration with Oak Park and River Forest public school districts 90, 97, and 200.



#### In our 15 years of service .....

PING! has matured from a small committee of volunteers to an independent 501(c)3 tax exempt charitable organization with an 18-member working Board of Directors.

We currently serve 154 4<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> graders in D90, 97 and 200.



**PING! Enrollment** 

#### **PING! offers instruments, enrichment and support**

- We loan band and orchestra instruments
  - Over 200 instruments, mainly donated
  - Housed in Hatch School instrument storage closet
  - Partnerships with Austin Music Center and Kagan & Gaines for repairs, maintenance and supplies
- We provide music enrichment opportunities throughout the year
  - Fall and spring workshops
  - Family concert field trips
  - Middle school mentoring



#### The power of middle school mentoring . . .

- High school musicians provide music instruction, mentoring and friendship every two weeks – averaging 950+ volunteer hours per year.
- The year culminates in a musical showcase.
- Music teachers observe improvement in music, organization and motivation. Parents notice more engagement and selfconfidence. More PING! students are continuing with music at OPRF. Each year more OPRF PING! students also become mentors.

#### A variety of **summer enrichment opportunities**

- D97 summer music camp
- Scholarships to "away" camps
- OPRF marching band camp
- Private lessons for incoming freshmen

## **Recent innovations and accomplishments**

- Recruitment of professional musician
  volunteers for high school private
  lessons so more students can participate
- Rhythm focus in fall and spring enrichment workshops – Gabby Rosenblum, Paul and Evan Jacobsen
- Increased summer camp enrichment opportunities
- Increased mentor training and support
- IMEA recognition presenting at the January 2013 conference on how to replicate PING!s model



### We know we make a difference

- Increased access 8-9% of all D97 instrumental music students are in PING!
- Benefits of music education -- Over 1200 *total* student years of music instruction
- **Positive role models** 950+ hours of middle school mentoring *each year*
- Smoother OPRF transition PING! student accomplishments and high participant graduation rates




