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


A variety of fresh fruits and vegetables are available daily on our offering bar. All of our breads and pastas are whole wheat or whole grain. GF options are available.



 Absolutely, as long as there is a teenage student living in the house. Costa Rican students come expecting

- 3) Does our family have to speak Spanish?
 Not The Costa Rican student comes to Oregon to improve English skills.
- 4) Do I have to be taking Spanish to host? Nopel
- by in it expensive so near? Your family is expected to provide room and board (food) for the Costa Rican student. The student brings money for his/her incidental expenses. Your cost is just an additional mouth to feed for 4 weeks.
- 6) What happens if the Costa Rican student gets sick? Costa Rican students come to Oregon with their own medical insurance. Chaperones are ready in all medical situations as needed.
- Do we have to cook special food?
 No. Let the Costa Rican student experience your normal mealtime routines.
- The student attends high school with his/her host brother/sister, but does not enroll in separate classes. The teachers do not need to assign or grade anything extra. Costa Ricans may be a resource for the Soanish teacher and come prepared to give a Costa Rica Presentation in any classes as requested.
- Costa Rican chaperones accompany the students and will be in Oregon to assist host families and students. The Host Program Coordinators and POA Committee are also available to assist you.




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
