The award for 2023-2024 reflects a Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) and Quality Improvement (QI) in the amount of \$139,554. The grant requires a local match of 20% or \$419,335. As a result of the Head Start Program, Denton ISD was able to serve 189 students in a full day Head Start program implemented by 11 highly qualified/certified, degreed teachers. The program includes a management staff providing oversight in the areas of child development and education, health services, nutrition services, family and community partnerships and disability services.
