Principal's General Narrative:

The Healthy Emerging Attitudes and Relationships for Tomorrow or H.E.A.R.T. Program for 8th grade students continues with a break being taken until after Spring Break.

Families for a Future has several participating families with a junior high connection. The students and parents that I have visited with have expressed positive views about the program.

Seventh grade students took the TAKS Writing Exam and continue to prepare for the Reading and Math Exams coming up a couple of weeks after we return from Spring Break. Teachers are also working with the eighth grade students to get them prepared for their tests in Math, Reading, Science and Social Studies.

English Language Arts / Reading teachers have been working on meeting requirements to satisfy collection and rating of writing and speaking abilities of LEP students for TELPAS. Three JH students have been tested under the TELPAS requirements.

Eight grade band students performed with the Brackett Tiger Band and helped the band to earn a Superior/1st Division rating in sight reading and an Excellent/2nd Division rating for their concert performance.

JH students are serving as kitchen assistants for the Chopped competition and also for the presentation of a Cooking With Kids lesson to the elementary students.

Teachers and staff are all working to make things go as well as they can in the Jr. High. Students are taking care of teacher assigned detentions in a timely manner. Students and teachers are involved with the learning processes before, during and after the regular school day. Math, Science, and Reading tutorials are being held and targeted students are attending. Coaches are involved with Tennis and Track.

Students will be transported to the Ft. Clark Theater for the One Act Play presentation of "Flowers for Algernon". They will return to campus after the performance to eat lunch and be dismissed at 1:00 p.m. for Spring Break.
