Why do we need a new graduation pathway?

Our goal: 100% of all 4th-year cohort students graduate on time with a high school diploma.
The leading reason students gave nationwide for not completing high school was that they "Got behind in school work or got poor grades" (National Center for Labor Statistics).

 GED Option 2 (GO2) <u>only</u> accepts candidates who test at a 9th-grade reading level

Students who get behind are more likely to stay behind.

Students who cannot access **GO2 risk getting** left behind.

Why do students go virtual? Why not GO2?

Health (physical/mental) **Negative experiences** with peers Distractions **Flexible schedule** family needs 0 Transportation Curriculum

Poor fit for high-stakes testing **Below 9th grade reading** score Accessibility (transportation) Better suited for coursework than testing

How does the competency pathway help?

- Seamless integration with pre-existing practices at DLVA
- Linear curriculum, flexible schedule
- Narrowed focus on core subjects
- Required postsecondary preparation
- Content mastery over time, not high-stakes testing
- Removes barrier of general elective requirements
- Serves all cohort students regardless of reading level

< 9.5 credits in core classes

 < 2.5 general elective credits

Juniors have the option to enroll in the pathway, then transition to GO2 in their senior year.

Accounts for students already on a trajectory that would require them to earn more credits in each semester (including summer) than a full credit load.

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Eligibility: 4th+ year cohort students

 <14 credits in core classes
 includes Health, Physical Education, Personal Finance

< 3.5 general elective credits

Seniors have the option to enroll in the pathway, then transition to GO2 when a seat opens.

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Bottom line: students earn a regular H.S. diploma by earning 16.5 credits.
