KHS Coach Atkinson named Citizen of the Year: Goodwill Industries of Fort Worth has named Keller High School Head Football Coach Kevin Atkinson its Citizen of the Year, and will present the award to him at its "Big Dreams Big Heart" luncheon next month.

Keller Coach Moe Fritz throws out first pitch at Ranger game: Keller girls' softball coach Moe Fritz threw out the ceremonial first pitch at the April 4 Texas Ranger's baseball game against Boston Red Sox. Pre-game ceremonies honored the reigning state- and national-champion Keller High School Lady Indian softball team and Coach Fritz, and the Voices of Central Show Choir performed the national anthem before the home-town crowd. Coach Fritz has led the team to two state titles in the last three years. In 2003, she was the USA Today High School Softball Coach of the Year, and has been named the District Coach of the Year for the last three years in a row.

KHS student wins Rotary Club speech contest: Recently Keller High student Anthony Carpenter won the Rotary Club Region speech contest by defeating 15 other students. Anthony will advance to the next level of competition in Abilene for a chance to win \$1,000. This is the first time that Keller ISD has ever had a Region Champion for the Rotary Club's 4-Way Test Speech Contest.

SKI student's art work shown on NBC 5: Brooke Nelson, a fifth-grader at South Keller Intermediate, was recently named the fifth grade winner for the Public Health Week Poster Contest. Brooke's artwork was shown on Monday Apr. 10, on NBC 5. Brooke also won a \$50 US Savings Bond and will be attending a ceremony in Fort Worth.

FHMS performs well at UIL band contest: The Fossil Hill Middle School band recently competed with more than 40 bands at UIL contest. FHMS was among only three varsity bands to receive straight 1 or superior ratings. The non-varsity group received all 1's in sight reading; no other non-varsity group scored as high in sight reading. More than 130 students participated in the competition which the band has been working toward since early February.

KISD schools finds success at UIL competition: Two Keller ISD schools were successful at the UIL One-Act Play competitions. Central High School was named as alternate play in District 9, Conference 4A performing scenes from "The Beggar's Opera" adapted by Charles Jeffries and Jerry Knight.
