Transferred Grades	When a student transfers grades for properly documented and eli- gible courses, the District shall assign weight to those grades based on the categories and grade weight system used by the Dis- trict if similar or equivalent courses are offered to the same class of students in the District.
Reporting Class Rank	Beginning with the class of 2024, <i>t</i> The District shall calculate class rank at the conclusion of each semester. Following each calculation period, each student ranked in the top six percent and top ten percent of the class shall receive written notification. Also following each calculation period, the District shall communicate to all students in the class the lowest weighted GPA in the first quartile of the class, in the second quartile of the class, and in the third quartile of the class.
Local Graduation Honors	For the purpose of determining honors to be conferred during grad- uation activities, the District shall calculate class rank in accord- ance with this policy and administrative regulations by using grades available at the time of calculation at the end of the third nine-week grading period of the senior year.

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	For the purpose of applications to institutions of higher education, the District shall also calculate class rank as required by state law. The District's eligibility criteria for local graduation honors shall ap- ply only for local recognitions and shall not restrict class rank for the purpose of automatic admission under state law. [See EIC(LE- GAL)]	
Valedictorian and Salutatorian	The valedictorian and salutatorian shall be the eligible students with the highest and second-highest ranking, respectively. To be el- igible for such recognition, a student must:	
	 Have been continuously enrolled in the District high school for the two school years immediately preceding graduation; 	
	 Have completed the foundation program with the distin- guished level of achievement; and 	
	 Be graduating after exactly eight semesters of enrollment in high school. 	
Breaking Ties	In case of a tie in weighted numerical grade averages or weighted GPAs after calculation to the thousandths place, the District shall recognize all students involved in the tie as sharing the honor and title.	
Honor Graduates	The District shall recognize at the graduation ceremony all stu- dents whose weighted numerical grade averages comprise the top ten percent of the students in the graduating class.	
Highest-Ranking Graduate	The student meeting the local eligibility criteria for recognition as the valedictorian shall also be considered the highest-ranking grad- uate for purposes of receiving the honor graduate certificate from the state of Texas.
