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In an effort to allow more flexibility for students to complete rigorous and relevant programs of study in Career and Technical Education, I refer to §TAC Chapter 74, Subchapter F for a creative solution. (See attached Texas Administrative Code)

I recommend the CISD Board Policy reflect language that awards Technology Application graduation credit in Career and Technology Programs of Study that meet the guidelines outlined in §TAC Chapter 74, Subchapter F, 10, D. I further recommend the following language:

Students enrolled in a designated Career and Technical Education (CTE) coherent sequence of study for three or more credits consisting of two or more state-approved career and technology courses in AchieveTexas programs of study will earn one technology application credit. The program of study must align with the knowledge and skills outlined in the designated approved technology applications course in §TAC Chapters 120, 123 and 126. The students will demonstrate proficiency outlined in the course planning guide in the use of technology prior to the beginning of grade 11. AchieveTexas Programs of study participating in this technology applications graduation requirement option will be published in high school course planning guides.
