




## Annual Report 2017-18

**Submitted to Minnesota Department of Education** 

- Served 10,135 community members birth to senior
  - 9,630 last year
  - o 7,710 in 2015-16
  - o 6,145 in 2014-15
- Worked with 47 groups using facilities
  - 42 groups last year
  - 36 groups in 2015-16
  - Bringing 18,213 visitors into the district
    - 18,213 visitors last year
    - 17,911 visitors 2015-16

## Audit Fiscal Year Ending 2018

#### Community Education Fund o4

- When considered with all district funds, community education is 4.1 percent (was 3.9% last year) of budget.
- With a budget of just over \$2 million, Community Education reduced its fund balance by \$11,765.
- The fiscal year ended with a positive Fund Balance just over \$600,000.
- The negative fund balance for School Readiness improved from (\$50,387) to (\$5,120)
- Support the General Fund by contributing 18.5% of CE budget the charge back in other districts is in the single digits. Will be looking into chargebacks further this year.

## **Facility Improvements**

Mentioned a variety of improvements at the October School Board meeting. Since then:

- Added additional passenger railings to Community Education bus.
- Built a carport/shelter for bus and two district vans.
- Ordered a Gaga Ball Pit for OHA.
- Shed by football stadium new siding, service doors and lighting improvements.
- Will be looking at improvements to the WW outdoor playground and the DEC fields.
