Factors that Make a Great High School

Demand more of each student and end dumbed-down tracks.

What we're doing: We've eliminated English Essentials, CIM Science, General Math and Pre-Algebra. Instead all students are given the opportunity to learn new material while reinforcing previous skills.

Build a schedule that gives teachers fewer than 150 students apiece. What we're doing: Though we've lost 5.5 teachers in the past 2 years, the trimester schedule has kept teacher workloads below the 150 mark for nearly all of our teachers.

Get teachers talking.

What we're doing: During our Late Start inservice sessions, we focus on educational topics but make sure that sharing and inspiring each other is a big part of our work.

Assign academic work worthy of being showcased.

What we're doing: As a staff, we need to encourage projects that require higher order thinking skills. Already we have writings, artwork and projects in various classes that do this.

Create student advisories.

What we're doing: Every student and staff member at NVHS is part of a TEAM of about 20 students. The TEAM activities include careers, academics and social activities.

Make every minute matter.

What we're doing: "Bell-to-bell instruction" is an expectation school-wide. Why? Because if every teacher quit teaching 5 minutes before the bell just 5th period every day, that wasted time would cost taxpayers \$50,000!

Help kids choose courses.

What we're doing: We begin educating students in 8th grade about their choices and what colleges will want. TEAM advisors help students with course requests and Counselors and the Principal go over every student's schedule.

Turn seniors into mentors.

What we're doing: Every freshman has a Link Crew mentor for his/ her first term on campus.

Give parents, students and teachers more say.

What we're doing: We are working to communicate more regularly with parents by email and other means. Our Site Council and PRIDE (PBS) Team meetings are open to all. We are conducting a School Climate Survey now and hope to get your input. Please contact me any time with your suggestions or concerns.

Captivate students with real-world lessons.

What we're doing: Every teacher's course planning process requires a real-world activity for each unit taught.


