

Smarter Balanced Assessment

Our 3rd-5th grade students will be taking the Smarter Balanced Assessment starting Monday, April 13th. Parents, it is important that your child is getting a good night's sleep and is eating a healthy breakfast each and every day. This testing can be stressful for your child and it is important to remain positive and help encourage your child. It is also important to make sure your child arrives on time because these rigorous tests are very time consuming. We want our students to have the best chance possible of demonstrating their knowledge effectively. Each student will have to take a computer adaptive test (CAT) and a performance task (PT) in both English/Language Arts and Math. The following are the tentative dates students will be testing:

- April 13th-17th—English/Language Arts CAT Test
- April 20th-24th—English/Language Arts PT Test
- May 4th-8th--Math CAT Test
- May 11th -15th-Math PT

If you are interested in seeing a practice test and what it will look like for your child, you can visit <u>www.oaksportal.</u>org, click on "students" and then "sample tests". Our 5th graders will also be taking the state Science test on March 17th.
