We use exclusively High-Quality Instructional Materials (HQIM) vetted by the Arkansas Initiative for Instructional Materials (AIIM).

- Amplify Core Knowledge Language Arts (CKLA)

- Amplify Desmos Math
- Amplify Science
- Wilson Reading System

In addition to state approved HQIM materials delivered through excellent instruction (AMS LR has 94% teacher retention this year!), we also:

- Conduct weekly Data Dives in PLCs
- Provide 1-hour daily student intervention blocks
- Offer Afterschool and Saturday tutoring

In 2023, we set out to give hundreds of the nearly 12,000 students attending D or Frated schools near AMS Little Rock a thriving place to learn.

In 2025, we are proud to say that our 497 students are on the right path to success. We're grateful for students, staff, parents, and community members who are now part of the AMS family.

In 2026 and beyond, we are ready to expand our service to even more students and families at AMS Little Rock.



Enrollment Projections

Preparing for Next Year

Ahead of the 2025-2026 school year, we've begun re-enrollment for our current students and made some improvements. Based on feedback from parents that our enrollment system for the 2024-2025 school year was cumbersome to navigate, we've partnered with Enroll Arkansas to use their platform. Specifically designed for Arkansas state systems, we've already received positive feedback from parents enrolling for next year.

As of early May, 418 of 471 (SY25 8th grade is excluded) of our current students have enrolled for the 2025-2026 school year. As a first-year school, so many students and their families signing up for next year gives us tremendous confidence.

89% of current AMS Little Rock students have re-enrolled for 2025-2026.





Enrollment Projections

Looking forward to next year, we're preparing to serve more students and families. We are seeking approval for an enrollment cap of 750 students for the AMS Schools - Arkansas charter. 750 students represents AMS Little Rock's maximum instructional building capacity.

Based on enrollment trends, we are projecting 668 students for the 2025-2026 school year. As of May, we have 322 new student applications and expect around 48% to attend school on day 1.

As a first year school, we expect AMS Little Rock's historical 48% conversion rate to increase over the summer as families look for new school options. In Arizona, we convert around 68% of the students who receive an offer of enrollment. One of our longest standing schools converts around 84% of the students/families who apply for enrollment.
