Mrs. Hansen and I presented on College, Career & Military Readiness and Career & Technical Education updates utilizing the Career Craft platform that works with Ascender to track our students CCMR indicator data that factors into our A-F Accountability. In addition, we can track our CTE students status as explorer, participant, concentrator or completer and track their Industry Based Certifications earned.



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These are just a few examples of how we can track CCMR and CTE data easily through this platform. I also outlined action items for our campus CCMR Advisory Board to begin working on, such as, breaking down our TAPR CCMR data to determine areas of strength and weakness to develop goals for the next four years and develop a K-12 CCMR Marketing Plan.
