





BRIDGING TOMORROW'S CAREERS WITH TODAY'S STUDENTS

Middle College allows students to simultaneously earn a high school diploma and an associate degree. The student body consists of high school juniors and seniors enrolled in dual-credit courses at ICC.

BENEFITS OF MIDDLE COLLEGE

- Expands learning opportunities for highly motivated students.
- Provides the opportunity to complete Associate of Art or Associate of Applied Science degrees with up to 60 hours of transferable college credit to institutes of higher learning.

ELIGIBILITY

- Be a high school junior (14 core Carnegie units) who has completed Algebra II in good standing with a GPA of 3.0 above.
- Meet eligibility criteria for dual credit/dual enrollment (17 ELA and 19 Math sub score on the ACT).
- Submit a written recommendation from the middle college / secondary counselor.
- Demonstrate appropriate, responsible, respectful and mature behavior on the high school campus.

ESTIMATED COST PER SEMESTER

- Registration Fee \$50
- Tuition \$1,450 [\$140 per hour capped at \$1,450 for 12-20 hours]
- Course Material Fees \$300 estimate [\$30-\$130 per ICC class]
- Technology Fee \$60 [\$5 per credit hour with a cap at \$60]
- Total Estimated Cost \$1,890*
- *There will be other small fees that will not occur every semester, including the transcript fee, ID badge fee, and parking decal if applicable.

Associate of Arts • Associate of Applied Science

CHOOSE TO TRANSFER

The **ASSOCIATE OF ARTS (A.A.) DEGREE** is awarded for the successful completion of courses designed as the first two years of a four-year college/university curriculum leading to a bachelor's degree while also receiving a high school diploma. The degree encompasses programs listed in the ICC catalog and requires the completion of 60 semester hours with an overall grade point average of 2.0 or above on those hours applied towards graduation.

CHOOSE TO GET A JOB

The **ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE (A.A.S.) DEGREE** is designed to meet the educational needs of students who are seeking preparation for employment in occupational fields not requiring a baccalaureate degree. The pursuit of this pathway would result in a high school diploma, industry certification credential, and A.A.S. Students in this track can pursue the following pathways - Computer Programming Technology, Hospitality Management Technology, Law Enforcement Technology, Paralegal Technology, and Public Health Technology. Future tracks may be added after the initial implementation year.

HOW TO ENROLL

- Meet with your high school guidance counselor to express interest and gather required information.
- Submit ICC required enrollment forms. Apply online at https://apply.iccms.edu/
- Transcripts and ACT scores will need to be submitted to ICC to confirm eligibility
- Submit written recommendation from your high school principal or guidance counselor.
