ACTION ITEMS

Consider Approval of MOU for Boys and Girls Club After School Programming at Navarro Middle School and Pink Elementary School with Funding Through TCLAS

Dr. Terri Mossige presented information on the Boys and Girls Club after school programming at Navarro Middle School and Pink Elementary School with funding through TCLAS.

Mrs. Danziger asked how students would be chosen to participate. Dr. Mossige said that students are selected through an application process and tutoring needs.

Mrs. Danziger asked if there is a limit to the number of students that can participate. Dr. Mossige said there is not a limit at this time.

Mr. Lambert asked if the program will be licensed. Dr. Mossige said that Boys and Girls Club is licensed.

Mr. Lambert asked if the staff will be employees of the District. Dr. Mossige said that the teachers will be Lamar CISD employees with the funding coming from TCLAS.

Mr. Welch asked for an explanation of TCLAS Grant 11 funds. Dr. Mossige explained why the District was awarded TCLAS funds.

Mr. Welch asked how the program will be funded in the future if the District no longer receives TCLAS funds. Dr. Mossige said the District will work with the Boys and Girls Club to seek outside funding.

It was moved by Mrs. Danziger seconded by Mrs. Bronsell that the Board of Trustees approve the MOU for the Boys and Girls Club After School Programming at Navarro Middle School and Pink Elementary School with Funding Through TCLAS. The motion carried unanimously.

FUTURE ACTION ITEMS

Discussion of Order Authorizing the Issuance of Lamar CISD Unlimited Tax Schoolhouse Bonds, Series 2023; Approving the Preparation of an Official Statement; and Enacting Other Provisions Relating Thereto

Ms. Jill Ludwig presented information on an order authorizing the issuance of Lamar CISD Unlimited Tax Schoolhouse Bonds, Series 2023; and on approving the preparation of an official statement; and enacting other provisions.

Discussion of Board Approving Committee to Develop a District of Innovation Plan

Dr. Mossige presented information on the Board of Trustees approving a committee to develop a District of Innovation plan.

Mrs. Danziger asked what the District can do to ensure that Lamar CISD does not encounter negative issues when implementing a district of innovation plan. Dr. Nivens explained the limited options Lamar CISD intends to use the when adopting a district of innovation plan.

Mr. Welch asked if the submitted plan to TEA is binding on the District and can Lamar CISD deviate from that plan. Dr. Mossige explained that the plan must be posted for 30 days and must be approved by the Board. She added that any amendments would require approval by the Trustees. Dr. Nivens added that the Board is the final authority on the district of innovation plan.

Mr. Welch asked if the plan would remove teacher planning periods and teacher lunch periods. Dr. Mossige said that teachers make up a majority of the DSIC and she does not believe they would be in favor of adding that to the plan. She added that the District also has not discussed adding that to the plan. Dr. Nivens said that it would be unwise to remove teacher planning periods and teacher lunch periods.

Mr. Welch asked if the district of innovation plan would allow non-certified teachers to teach. Mr. Bates explained that in emergency situations administration can request that the Board approve a temporary authorization for a permit to teach, but said that is a very rare occurrence. He added that the district of innovation plan could allow individuals with years of industry experience to be hired to teach a CTE course. Dr. Nivens said the district of innovation plan would be used to help find teachers for specific CTE classes and hard to fill positions such as foreign languages.

Mr. Welch asked if being a district of innovation would take away a teacher's rights to appeal through the normal process. Mr. Bates said that changing the Chapter 21 rights for teachers has not been presented as part of the plan. He added that any changes would have to be approved by the Board of Trustees.

Mrs. Williams asked about the survey process and what feedback would be shared from the district of innovation survey. Dr. Mossige said the DSIC would convene after the Board approves the DSIC to meet to begin consideration on the plan. She added that a survey is an option to consider for obtaining input, but feedback from the community is also expected at the public hearing.

Mrs. Williams asked if onboarding would be provided for any non-certified teachers hired as a result of the district of innovation distinction. Dr. Mossige said the District is working to create a program that will train alternatively certified teachers and paraprofessionals. Mr. Bates added that non-certified teachers would be held to the same expectations as certified teachers.

Mrs. Danziger asked how non-certified teachers will be catorgized within the District. Mr. Bates said non-certified teachers will be on the same pay scale as teachers and would also have the same evaluation process as certified teachers.

Dr. Nivens said there are 1030 schools districts in Texas and 900 have the district of innovation distinction.

Discussion of Gray Elementary School Attendance Boundary Process

Ms. Cole-Hamilton presented information on the attendance boundary process for Gray Elementary School.

Mrs. Danziger requested that parents and the community be allowed an opportunity to share comments on the zoning options before the Board votes on the options.

Mr. Welch requested that the District utilize all of its resources when communicating the zoning options to parents. He also recommended that the attendance boundary committee have the opportunity to submit a modified zoning map.

Mr. Hunt discussed the number of modified maps the Board would accept from the attendance boundary committee.

Dr. Nivens said the District is going to use its resources to frequently communicate to the parents impacted by the rezoning. He added that the traffic flow and traffic patterns for each zoning option would be discussed with the Trustees.

The Board of Trustees came to a consensus that the attendance boundary committee will be allowed to submit one zoning map modification to the Board.
