### School Board Goal 2018 – 2019 Implement a sustainable mental health delivery model in each school.


Preparing self-directed learners to thrive in a changing global community

### Recommendation from American Academy of Pediatrics

Mental Health is primarily discussed as if the terms were synonymous with problems (e.g., emotional disturbance, violence, and substance abuse) thereby countering efforts to pursue the school's role in promoting positive social and emotional development

**Recommendation**: a comprehensive, multifaceted, and integrated approach that places mental health in schools into proper perspective as a major force for addressing barriers to learning and promoting healthy development

- School provides office space & phone
- Grants & Medical Insurance
