Goal One - Learning

Our winter assessment season is just around the corner in January. All grade levels will be completing AIMSweb Plus winter benchmarking in ELA and math, while 2nd grade students will also participate in MAP benchmark testing in both areas. The



data gathered from these assessments plays an important role in helping us ensure we are meeting the academic needs of every student. It also provides valuable information for identifying students who may benefit from additional challenges or targeted support. These mid-year check-ins allow us to celebrate growth, adjust instruction where needed, and continue moving our students toward their individual learning goals.

Goal Two - Whole Student

On November 11th, our school proudly hosted a Veterans Day Assembly to honor 20 veterans from our community. Each guest was recognized and presented with a Certificate of Appreciation and a special lapel pin as a token of our gratitude for their service. Students and staff participated in songs, reflections, and a whole school photo that made the event both meaningful and memorable.
