2025 Program Impact

99% of Future City Competition participants strengthened their project management skills while working on their cities

95% of students at CreativeCon learned that creativity is a skill that can be practiced and strengthened

FROM THE DIRECTOR



We are especially proud of our partnership with the Region 11 Low Incidence Project at BrightWorks to coordinate the first Minnesota Braille Challenge.






