PROGRAMS

Programs meet the unique educational and culturally related academic needs of American Indians and Alaska Natives; the education of Indian children and adults; the training of Indian persons as educators and counselors, and in other professions serving Indian people; and research, evaluation, data collection, and technical assistance.
