Student Health Advocates program is an 8-month, mostly virtual leadership opportunity

- \$300 stipend compensation if 13 out of the 16 meetings are attended
- Open to youth ages 14-22 in all parts of Oregon.
- Comprises a council of 15 members.
- Youth meet twice a month over Zoom.
- Some optional in-person gatherings throughout the year.
- Program duration is from November 2024 to June 2025.
- This year's focus is on youth engagement related to consent, healthy relationships, and bodily autonomy.

Student Illness and Absence

It is important to let us know that your child will not be attending so we do not worry about them. If your child is not at school, and we haven't heard from you, then you will receive an automated phone call notifying you of your child's absence.'

How long does my child need to wait to return to school after an illness?

The answer to this question depends on their symptoms. Our school has to follow the directives from the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) regarding when students may be readmitted to school after an illness. Please review the provided info from OHA. **Please also note that the period of exclusion often requires 24 hours away from school** (this is not a rule that the school developed, but one we have to follow).

PLEASE KEEP STUDENTS WITH SYMPTOMS OUT OF SCHOOL This list is school instructions, not medical advice. Please contact your health care provider with health concerns. SYMPTOMS OF ILLNESS THE STUDENT MAY RETURN AFTER... *The list below tells the shortest time to stay home A student may need to stay home longer for some illnesses. Fever: temperature of 100.4°F *Fever-free for 24 hours without taking fever-reducing (38°C) or greater medicine. New cough illness * Symptoms improving for 24 hours (no cough or cough is well-controlled). New difficulty breathing * Symptoms improving for 24 hours (breathing comfortably). Urgent medical care may be needed. Diarrhea: 3 loose or watery *Symptoms improving for 24 hours (no more than stools in a day OR not able to two bowel movements more than normal and no longer having accidents) OR with orders from doctor control bowel movements to school nurse. Vomiting: one or more *Symptom-free for 24 hours OR with orders from episode that is unexplained doctor to school nurse. *Symptom-free OR with orders from doctor to school Headache with stiff neck and fever nurse. Follow fever instructions above. Urgent medical care may be needed. Skin rash or open sores *Symptom free, which means rash is gone OR sores are dry or can be completely covered by a bandage OR with orders from doctor to school nurse Red eyes with colored drainage *Symptom-free, which means redness and drainage are gone OR with orders from doctor to school nurse Jaundice: new yellow color in eyes or skin *After the school has orders from doctor or local public health authority to school nurse Acting differently without a reason: *Symptom-free, which means return to normal unusually sleepy, grumpy, or confused. behavior OR with orders from doctor to school nurse. *After the school has orders from doctor to school Major health event, like an illness lasting 2 or more weeks OR a hospital stay, OR nurse AND after measures are in place for the student's health condition requires more care than safety. Please work with school staff to address special school staff can safely provide. health-care needs so the student may attend safel OREGON Health EDUCATION

Medication

All prescription and over-the-counter (OTC) medication must be administered at the office by trained personnel.

Medication that you want your child to take during the school day has to be brought to the office in the original container (or we cannot take possession of the medication). Parents must complete the medicine administration form before trained personnel can dispense medication to a child. ALL OTC medications must be handled through the office (this includes cough drops). If you have any questions about medication administration and school, please contact our main office.
