Cultural Inservice Day- September 13, 2025, Elder Marie Rexford shared the history of Kaktovik and Beautiful Inupiaq Artifacts with us. We cleaned and carved Baleen and made earrings.

Monthly newsletters are shared with all families to update them on student learning, achievement, school activities, and upcoming events.

Tumitchiat Sivunmun Plans (TSP) were created for high school students last school year and are being updated this school year. We are excited to see a lot of growth in our students as they determine their pathway forward in planning their future.

Our 3 Seniors traveled to Utqiagvik in September for 2-week intensive CTE courses in Heavy Equipment and Introduction to healthcare

Volleyball-Our team traveled to play in Atkasuk this weekend.

STEM- 5 middle school students have applied to attend the Middle School Conference with Ansep in November.

Choir- We have 20 students participating in choir this year.

Goal 4: Graduate bilingual students

Every grade level spends a class period in our Inupiaq Language Class.

We recite the pledge in Inupiaq during morning meetings daily.

Inupiaq Values have been shared and discussed during our morning meetings.





Student Social & Emotional Wellbeing

Goal 5: Facilitate & maintain culturally, emotionally, & physically safe learning environments

We start every day with a positive morning meeting message of appreciation, thankfulness, and encouragement for our students and staff.

Student of the Month is awarded each month based on student character, behavior, academic performance, citizenship, attendance, effort, social relationships, and overall improvement. Our students are announced during morning meetings, have their pictures on our student of the month bulletin board, and receive a reward.

Perfect Attendance- Students with perfect attendance are announced during morning meetings, have their pictures on our perfect attendance bulletin board, and receive a reward.

Lexia awards and positive praise are given to students during our Morning Meeting as they level up in their reading.

Every classroom has developed CHAMPS expectations to proactively impact classroom management by communicating expectations with our students to lead to better academic outcomes.

Ice Cream Social took place on October 16, 2025, to celebrate our students' improved attendance and academic growth.

October is Bullying Prevention Month: There will be a few districtwide activities for students in grades 6-12. These include: Wayfinder lessons, counselor-led classroom lessons, and door/bulletin board contest. The contest kickoff was on October 16, 2025 and 2 of our high school students shared the land acknowledgement with Assistant Superintendent Tracy Mulvenon during the districtwide Tumitchiat Sivunmun class period.

All Teachers are implementing district adopted curriculum in our classrooms.

Professional development has been provided to our staff during Professional Learning Communities (PLC's), In-service training days, CORE education consultants-experts in structured literacy. Professional development will continue throughout the school year.

The principal spends a considerable amount of time during the day observing classrooms and providing behavior management support as needed.

Our campus is fully staffed with classroom teachers. We have an instructional para position, library para position, and reading interventionist position open.
