Information Concerning School Violence Prevention and Violence Intervention Policies and Procedures .

The District maintains policies and procedures to address a variety of violence awareness and prevention strategies. These policies can be found in the District's Local Policy Manual at www.ozonaschools.net . Some related Policies include:

EHAC (LEGAL) - BASIC INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAM - REQUIRED INSTRUCTION (SECONDARY)

Campus Educational and Awareness components and activities include direct instruction in Violence Prevention, including Bullying and CyberBullying education and Dating Violence through Character Education and Counseling activities, as well as sponsored programs by approved partners with parental consent in conjunction with District Counseling services.

Educational Materials and Program content may be reviewed by contacting any campus Principal or Counselor.

Findings Resulting from Evaluations Conducted under the Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act (SDFSCA) of 1994 (20 U.S.C. Section 7101 et seq.).

Each year the District reviews findings related to School Safety and Drug-Free Schools solicited through the review of school discipline and event records and the administration of voluntary surveys. Some findings and responses from these activities in Fall 2011 (for 2011-2012) included:

Over 78% of Elementary and 85% of Secondary responders would grade CCCCSD School Safety as an "A" or "B"

Bullying and Relationship Conflict are the two most prevalent Safety concerns for students

45% of Elementary and 67% of Secondary responderss have witnessed either fighting or threats of physical harm at school

Almost 70% of Elementary and Middle grade responders report Drugs are not a problem ever at school. 36% of HS students .

70% of Elementary and Middle grade responders would not know where to obtain drugs. 38% for HS students.

72% of Elementary and Middle grade responders would report knowledge of a school safety concern Immediately versus 21% of High School responders who would only report if they could remain anonymous.

Specific responses by the District for 2012-2013 include the initiation of Why Try Character Education components at all levels via Counseling services and the implementation of an anonymous Bullying Prevention Hotline sponsored by a local industry partner.

Campuses are also dedicated to improving Emergency Preparedeness in 2012-2013 by attending regularly to rehearsal of Emergency Protocols and Drills during school hours and including local First Responders.

Report of 2009-2010 High School Graduates' Enrollment and Academic Performance in Texas Public Higher Education in FY 2011

Texas statute requires every school district to include, with their performance report, information received under Texas Education Code §51.403(e). This information, provided to districts from the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB), reports on student performance in postsecondary institutions during the first year enrolled after graduation from high school.

Student performance is measured by the Grade Point Average (GPA) earned by 2009- 2010 high school graduates who attended public four-year and two-year higher education in FY 2011. The data is presented alphabetically for each county, school district and high school. The bookmarks can be used to select the first letter of a county. Then the user can scroll down to the desired county, school district and high school.

For each student, the grade points and college-level semester credit hours earned by a student in fall 2010, spring 2011, and summer 2011 are added together and averaged to determine the GPA. These GPAs are accumulated in a range of five categories from < 2.0 to > 3.5. If a GPA could not be calculated for some reason, that student is placed in the "Unknown" column. GPA data is only available for students attending public higher education institutions in Texas. If a high school has fewer than five students attending four-year or two-year public higher education institutions, the number of students is shown but no GPA breakout is given. If a student attended both a four-year and a two-year institution in FY 2011, the student's GPA is shown in the type of institution where the most semester credit hours were earned.

The number of students located at Texas independent institutions is presented. Also shown are "not trackable" graduates, those with non-standard ID numbers that cannot be used to match student identifiers at Texas higher education institutions. "Not found" graduates have standard ID numbers but were not located in FY 2011 at Texas higher education institutions. They might have enrolled in higher education outside of Texas.

No data is given for high schools with 25 or fewer graduates.

Because the statute calls for data on the first year enrolled after graduation, the level of the institution attended by students in this report may not match that given in THECB's high school to college report at http://www.txhighereddata.org/Interactive/HSCollLink.cfm. That report shows where students attended in the fall semester after their high school graduation year. This report attributes students to the level of institution where they earned the most semester credit hours during the whole academic year, not just the fall semester.

Please note: In May 2012 the 2006-2007, 2007-2008, and 2008-2009 versions of the *Report of High School Graduates' Enrollment and Academic Performance in Texas Public Higher Education* were updated to reflect a minor correction in how the GPA data are distributed across ranges.
