Family Groups at ELC

We have loved hosting families at the Early Learning Center for groups. This school year, we have hosted 27 groups, offering a variety of ways for parents to learn new skills, meet other parents and support their child in early learning.

Birth to 3 Groups offer something for every family and every child, from the tiniest babies to our students who are ready for preschool.

Parent Child Interaction

Something to try: offering choices

When parents offer their children choices when playing, their children do better on school readiness tasks when they get older! Even little babies can make choices and this helps their brains grow and develop.

Babies can make choices by looking at a toy they like. They might also grab for a toy or move their body towards a toy.

Toddlers might point to a toy they like. They might also make sounds to tell you what they want to play with.

Older toddlers may start to use a word or part of a word. They may say things like "no" to make a choice or "B-b-b" to tell you they want a book.

How does your child respond when you offer them a choice?



Activity Bag Fun!

December Activity Bags are going out now! This month's bag offers lots of materials for you to interact with your child and help get them ready to go to school one day.

- ★ Talk to your child about colors and sizes as you make a craft
- \star Point to the pictures in a winter or holiday book as you talk about the pictures
- ★ Shake the bells for your child and talk to them about what you hear.
- ★ Have them shake the bells "up high" or "down low"
- ★ Roll the ball and talk about the shape, color or how it moves

Books, Books, Books!

Birth to 3 Families are raising readers! Our Program goal is to support all families to increase how often they read or tell stories to their child. Many families also write a family goal to work with literacy skills as well.

Our Program offers many ways for families to help support early reading skills.

• Every family chooses 2 books each month to keep



- Families are offered a "book bin" to keep their child's books
- Weekly Library story group where each family goes home with a copy of the book
- Book Tracking Program where families can earn prizes for tracking how often they read
- Book sharing at every group and a book to take home too!
- Home Visit activities that use books
- Twice year "Reading Celebration" Family events

One of the most important ways you can help your child be ready to go to school one day is by sharing books with them every single day!
