



Critical Components of Literacy




Literacy Structures in the Classroom



Primarily for fluency and comprehension

grade-level text





targeted to students needs

Could be decodable texts, could be a novel

above grade level lexile text

Primarily for oral language development & comprehension


Professional Learning

Books, Books, Books

- Across the K-5 years, students will have been exposed to 265 titles.
- An increase in the time students spend reading and the volume (amount of text) read has already been evident in classrooms.
- Students have already engaged with a variety of genres and topics.





From the Classroom ...

- <u>All</u> students are engaged in discussions about texts in shared reading, building comprehension and language skills.
- Rich **vocabulary** from classroom instruction is being heard in student conversations.
- Students are seeking out books in the library from the series they are reading in the classroom. They want to read more!
