

# SYNERVOICE

After receiving an automated call concerning your student's absences from our new phone messaging system, Synervoice, please call the school in the morning to clear your student's absences. The number is 541-592-2116; ask for the attendance office. It is very important for you and your student to have these absences cleared. Students end up doing lunch detentions for uncleared absences.

We will sometimes use Synervoice to send out important messages about school closures and school events. When you get a call from the school using Synervoice, it is important that you say "hello" as this triggers the message. If you have voicemail, it will leave a message. If you have email registered with the school, we will often send emails as well.

# **Soccer Camp**

The boys and girls soccer teams from Illinois Valley High School will be hosting their second

annual Summer Soccer Skills Camp this summer. Camp will be held August 6th through the 10th on the campus of IVHS, and is open to all current and prospective high school players for the upcoming fall season. The camp includes half-day sessions for both the girls and the boys teams, with sessions to be held separately. Guest coaches are provided by Challenger Sports and drawn from a pool of highlyqualified European players and coaches. 
# Varsity Letter Awards

# **SENIOR SKIP DAY**

Parents, please note that there is **no** sanctioned senior skip day. We do not encourage nor endorse a skip day for seniors. From past knowledge and experience most senior skip days involve alcohol and drugs and often older ex-students attend and provide those things. Things that the students did not plan happen—sometimes with serious consequences. Additionally, in the past several years there has been serious vandalism done to the property where the gatherings took place. Senior classes have lost some of their senior funds because of this vandalism.

If senior students take a skip day, absences will not be excused.

We ask for parents to help us with this and encourage your students to not participate in a senior skip day.

### **SENIOR PROJECTS—MUST BE COMPLETED TO GRADUATE !**

The last opportunity for seniors to present their projects is May 22, 2012 from 4:00 - 5:45. Most of the seniors have presented at the previous two opportunities. Senior parents, please, work with your student and encourage them to not procrastinate. Passing all components of the Senior Project is a requirement for graduation.

# **SENIOR ALL NIGHT GRAD PARTY**

Remember that students must check into the All-Night Safe and Sober Party in the IV Commons by 11:00 PM. Students arriving after that will not be admitted. The party will end at 5:00 AM. Parents need to know that students can leave any time they want to, but once they have left, they will not be allowed to come back to the party. Please talk to your student about communicating with you concerning his or her plans for this night. Chaperones will not call parents when students leave early.

# **ESSENTIAL INFORMATION FOR THE CLASS OF 2012**

In a few short days, our seniors will step into the next phase of their lives. For the most part they are anxious for this to happen and are excited about their futures. Life is a series of milestones, but high school graduation has to be one of the most important. It truly is that event that opens many other doors to students. It is the end of childhood and a step into the "real world" that parents and teachers have been talking about for the last four years.

Parents, this is the time of year to keep in close contact with the academic progress of your senior student. We have some seniors who are on a plan with counseling in order to complete all their credits for graduation on June 7th. Do not just assume that

your student is doing what needs to be done. Stay in contact with their teachers, Ms. Tucker or one of the administrators to make sure your student is on target.

As the year is quickly coming to an end, we need to make sure that students have everything that is required for graduation pulled together.

#### LIBRARY

All library books must be returned to Ms. Stehelin. If a book has been lost, it must be paid for. This is the time to do a sweep of bedrooms and other rooms in the house to find any library books or textbooks that belong to IVHS and get them returned.

#### **FEES AND FINES**

Graduating seniors will not receive their diploma until all fines and fees have been paid. Ms. Hall has kept you and your students informed of these fines. They can still walk at graduation but the diploma cover will not hold their official diploma. Call the school and speak to Ms. Hall if you have questions.

#### GRADES

All grades must be cleared by Ms. Tucker by 3:30 PM on June 1st. No extra time will be given to complete coursework in order to walk in graduation. If a student is failing a class or has not completed a class on June 1st that is required for graduation, the student will not walk in graduation. Students may continue working until June 13 in order to earn a 2012 diploma.

#### **GRADUATION PRACTICE**

There are two graduation practices—both are mandatory—and students must be on time. The first is on Wednesday, June 6th, from 1:00— 3:00 PM. It will be in the gym. The second is on Thursday, June 8th, from 10:00 AM —12:00 PM. It will be in the gym or on the football field, depending on the weather. Seniors need to bring their caps and gowns to the Thursday practice where a group photo will be taken. Information on purchasing pictures will be given at the Tuesday practice.

#### 2+2 CREDITS

Many of our vocational classes and a few of our core classes can earn 2+2 credit. These credits are transcripted to RCC and will count in most Oregon Community Colleges and Oregon Universities. The credits are at no cost to the students. We have students who start college with 12 or more credits. Students must have received an A or B in the class to earn credit. Students who have taken 2+2 classes must register before the end of the school year if they want credit. Credits do not transfer into the next year. They will NOT be able to come back in the fall and get those credits transcripted.

**PURPOSE:** Credit recovery. Students must have taken the class previously and failed it. Seniors who need more that 7.5 credits to graduate and 5<sup>th</sup> year seniors may be able to work on other classes.

#### HOW MANY CREDITS CAN BE EARNED?

Up to 1.5 credits (three trimester classes) for credit recovery. Students must be there every day for the full time and work hard to complete that much credit. Most students will only be able to complete one trimester class and earn  $\frac{1}{2}$  a credit.

**WHAT ARE THE CLASSES LIKE:** All classes will be taken online – through Ed Options. Students will work individually on the computer to complete classes. There will be support available from teachers and staff.

**CHARGE:** There will be a charge of \$50.00 for each class. However, upon successful completion of the class, students will required to pay \$10.00 for each class. This means that if you complete three classes – or 1.5 credits, it will cost you \$30.00 This is how it will work:

- An initial non-refundable deposit of \$5.00 will be required to secure a "slot".
- The remaining \$5.00 for the first class will be paid on or before the first day of summer school.
- If students do not complete the course or drop out of summer school, an additional \$40.00 will be billed to the student's school account. No monies will be refunded.
- If students cannot pay the remaining \$5.00 before summer school, please contact JoAnn Bethany or Patrice Tucker and arrange a payment plan.

**SUBJECTS**: Various classes in English, Math, Science, Social Studies, Health. Most appropriate classes for you to make up will be decided by counselor and administration.

**ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS**: Depending on what you need to make up, attendance requirements will be set for all or part of the four-week term. Once a commitment of time has been set, it is expected that students will be there every day.

# **TRSD POLICY JN—STUDENT FEES, FINES, & CHARGES**

Per district (policy JN) and state law (HB# 3044 passed in 2003), student report cards, diplomas, and/or other school records cannot be released if fines totaling \$50.00 or more are still owed. Transcript transfer requests will be honored.

It is important that these fines are paid in a timely manner as they stay on the record and graduating students who owe fines will not get their diploma until all fines are paid. Sometimes these fines accumulate to over \$300 and this expense is hard on families at the time of graduation. The district may pursue the matter through a private collection agency or other method available to the district.

Certainly, the first thing you should do is to ask your student to look for the missing books, athletic uniforms, etc. If these items can be found and returned to the school, these fines will be removed and the record will be cleared.
