After a lengthy discussion about the groups fundraising efforts, and the money needed to send the students to Nationals, the board agreed to table the discussion until the June 12th meeting to allow FBLA to continue to fund raise and see how much is actually needed. The Board agreed that they would fund the expenses for the advisor and the traditional \$1,000. The Board would like to see more parent buy-in and would also like to see FBLA be more proactive in their fund raising efforts in the future.

Mr. Zaugg asked if the members had any questions about the curriculum adoption. No board member raised a question. Mr. Zaugg then provided the members with an update on the music program. He shared that they went to the league festival in April, they did not earn enough points to make it to state.

He shared that while piloting the curriculum that the board adopted, the 6th grade students put on a student lead musical. The music was provided by the curriculum, but the students wrote the lyrics. The musical was about bullying.

Mr. Zaugg stated that thanks to Mr. Sybouts he will have \$11,000 for new instruments. The district owns several trumpets, clarinets and flutes. These are used for students who cannot afford a rental instrument. He sent a proposal to Mr. Erlebach suggesting that the District move away from instrument rental and perhaps subsidize the instrument rent for students instead.

PBIS Presentation, Principals

Ms. Nugent reported that they have had a reboot of their PBIS program. They have had Pam Hallvik working with them to improve their implementation and staff training.

Ms. Woika, shared that PBIS is not new to her building. She reviewed her behavior data with the Board.

Ms. Buckmaster explained that in her building they are proud of their positive behaviors. She and her PBIS team meet every month to review the data, the team identifies where their problems are and devise a plan to correct. They then communicate the plan to all staff.

Mr. Baertlein shared that the numbers are being crunched. We are looking at anything and everything to cut costs. Mr. Erlebach stated that we are in negotiations with contractors. We will know within a couple of days the outcome and will provide information to the board at that time. Mr. Erlebach stated that it looks like the Board will need to meet again before May 22<sup>nd</sup>. Discussion occurred.

The Board directed the superintendent to ask Mr. Koehler what the cost difference would be if the track went back to a six lane track with new lighting, as well as addressing the safety issues with the Pole Vault and Javelin areas.

Nehalem Elementary School Seismic Upgrades, Mark Sybouts

Mr. Sybouts shared that the contractor has bid out the portions of the work that they will not do themselves. Once they receive that information they will put together the guaranteed maximum price that the Board will need to vote on at the May 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting.

Additionally, there was a mandatory meeting today at the high school for the roof over the library through the art classroom. Mr. Sybouts shared that he did have three contractors at the meeting. Mr. Ryan asked if any were local. Mr. Sybouts stated that two of them are coming from over in the valley, but have done other roof work for the District in the past.
