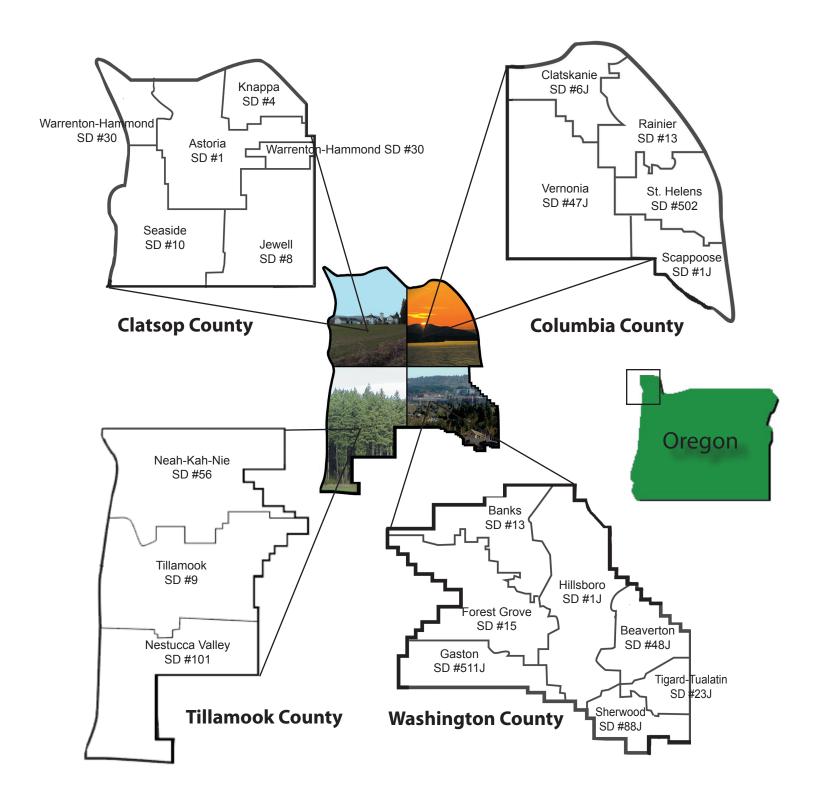

2011-12 Board of Directors

The Board works closely with the ESD's superintendent to determine district policies and to ensure that the highest quality programs and services are being delivered to schools in the region.

ANN SAMUELSON, CHAIR

Business position

Ann is president of Astoria Mechanical and Trailblazer Construction. She also serves as a Clatsop County Commissioner for District Five. Ann has served on the Meth Prevention Team, Diversity Action Committee, and was a citizen lobbyist/author of SB304 (Asbesto-related issues) in a recent legislative session.

RENÉE BRUCE, VICE CHAIR

Social Service position

Renée has worked for Community Action for the past 18 years, and currently serves as Director of Family & Community Resources. She serves on the following boards; C.A.S.H. – Creating Assets Savings & Hope, Essential Health Clinic, Washington County Housing Advisory Board, and chairs the Washington County Childhood Care and Education Advisory Committee.

EARL FISHER

Zone 4: Beaverton (Beaverton and Sunset high school attendance areas), Clatskanie, Rainier, Scappoose, St. Helens, and Vernonia school districts

Earl retired from education with over 34 years of service. He spent the last three years of his career as Administrator of the Northwest Regional ESD's Clatsop Service Center in Astoria, retiring in 2003. At-Large position

Zone 2: Astoria, Jewell, Knappa, Seaside, Warrenton-Hammond, Neah-Kah-Nie, Nestucca Valley, Tillamook, Banks, and Forest Grove school districts

Kathleen retired from education in 2000 after teaching in the Hillsboro and Lake Oswego school districts. Her 32-year career included elementary principalships in McMinnville and Seaside. Kathy served on Clatsop Commission for Children and was on the board of the Salvation Army in Clatsop County. She is currently active in Community Tsunami Awareness Group (T.A.G.) and the Seaside Library Art Committee.

LARRY SPIER

Zone 3: Hillsboro School District

Larry retired from education in 2002 with over 33 years of service. He spent the last 28 years as a special education teacher and school administrator with the Beaverton School District. He served on the former Washington County ESD, and was board chair for NWRESD during the 2006-07 school year. He is currently serving his fifth year on the Board of Directors for St. Mary's Home for Boys, and is self-employed as a behavioral consultant to school districts.

GAIL YOUNG

Zone 1: Gaston, Sherwood, and Tigard-Tualatin school districts Gail is a former member of both the Washington County ESD Board and the Washington Service Center Advisory Committee. Prior to serving on the Washington ESD Board, she served on the Douglas County ESD Board. Gail is self-employed as a vocational consultant.

EARLY INTERVENTION/EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION SERVICES

Department Overview

Component school districts may request evaluation of children, birth to age 5, who have suspected delays for the purpose of determining their eligibility for Early Intervention or Early Childhood Special Education services. The El/ECSE Evaluation Team includes Early Childhood Education Specialists, Speech-Language Pathologists, Occupational Therapists, Physical Therapists, and School Psychologists. Evaluations include a review of existing information and developmental, speech, language, behavior, and psychological assessments if needed. Evaluations are classified as File Review (review of existing records only), Partial Evaluation (only one developmental area assessed), or Full Evaluation (two or more developmental areas assessed). Interpretation services are used with families who are not fluent in English.



Top Accomplishments and Key Focus Areas

TOP ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2011-12

- Transitioned 656 children to kindergarten on September 1st: 54 children in Clatsop County; 48 children in Columbia County; 18 children in Tillamook County and 536 children in Washington County.
- Completed 2002 early intervention/early childhood special education evaluations. This is an increase of 345 more evaluations than the 2010-2011 year.
- The early intervention/early childhood special education program has developed a lesson plan template to be utilized across all classrooms.

- Continue to focus on implementing Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (PBIS) for all Early Intervention and Early Childhood Special Education Programs.
- Continue to create new partnerships with community preschools to provide services for children enrolled in the early childhood special education program.
- Continue to increase child find activities to ensure children who are eligible and their families have access to services.
- Align and implement curriculum planning and implementation of the lesson plan template across the early intervention/early childhood special education program.

RELATED SERVICES

Department Overview



NWRESD provides services from birth to age 21 that are specifically designed to provide access to specialists with training and experience in working with students with autism spectrum disorder (ASD), severe orthopedic impairments, vision impairments, hearing impairments, and speech and language impairments. Programs and services include: Assessments to determine special education eligibility and education planning; Audiology; Physical therapy and occupational therapy; Speech/language; Specialized classrooms for deaf and hard of hearing students; Itinerant services (educational consultation and direct services) for students who are blind/visually impaired, deaf/hard of hearing, or have severe orthopedic impairments, as well as interpreter services for students who are deaf/hard of hearing.

Top Accomplishments and Key Focus Areas

TOP ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2011-12

- Piloted a Social/communication class for students with Asperger Syndrome: Curriculum included information and training supporting students to learn skills in the areas of working and communicating with others, self-awareness and cyber-bulling.
- Targeted professional development in-service for all department staff on poverty. Dr. Donna Beegle
 provided an engaging and thought-provoking presentation to the Department about the effects of poverty.
 Participants gained a deeper understanding of poverty and its impacts on people, and also learned about
 a strengths based approach when working with persons experiencing poverty as well as the importance of
 building stronger partnerships within our organization and with community members.
- Collaborated with districts, staff provided district-wide trainings in the area of Augmentative
 Communication/Assistive Technology (AC/AT) to several districts. Staff support was also provide to districts
 via teleconferencing and by sharing access to pre-recorded training modules specific to student needs.
 Program staff (AC Specialists) accessed funding for over \$100,000 worth of dedicated devices for students in
 our four county region, resulting in increased cost savings for the districts, but most importantly to support
 access for students.

- Develop and increase ways to implement long-distance learning/trainings with districts and/or students.
- Provide opportunities for families and educators to access workshops and trainings regarding best practices in meeting the needs of children with disabilities utilizing the new Resource Center at Hillsboro Education Center.
- Utilize technology (iPads) with students of all disability-types within our region.
- Provide increased support to all 20 school districts by offering regular face to face contact with districts in all 4 counties as well as those within the Cascade Alliance.

DEPARTMENT OF SCHOOLS

Department Overview

Behavioral Programs: The district provides special education to students in kindergarten through 12th grade with a wide range of specialized classrooms and schools for children with significant developmental, emotional, and behavioral disabilities. Classes operated by NWRESD deliver instruction by licensed teachers and instructional assistants who provide the necessary supervision, special education, and related services.

GED Testing Services: The ESD offers GED (General Equivalency Diploma) testing to qualified applicants at the district's Regional Office in Hillsboro and at the Columbia Service Center in St. Helens.

Home School Registration Services: Oregon Revised Statutes require ESDs to provide monitoring services for students for whom parents have chosen home schooling. The system is now online and providing all access to parents for required paperwork and documentation.

Northwest Outdoor Science School: The program gives students opportunities to experience the natural world in an outdoor setting, including Residential Outdoor School and Spring Break Outdoor School for 5th and 6th graders, Environmental Education Field Studies for 5th through 8th grade classes, and Cascade Education Corps for at-risk high school students.



Top Accomplishments and Key Focus Areas

TOP ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2011-12

- Day treatment program implemented using alternative methods of assessment to allow high school students to meet the benchmarks that are required for awarding the regular diploma.
- Cascade and Pacific Academy staff and students explored a program about tolerance and understanding, formal competition at the Rose Festival Dragon Boat Races, Cascade and Pacific basketball program, and all staff participated in a Well Being Project, sponsored by the Oregon Research Institute
- Outdoor School increased student and district participation, and began work to align curriculum to the new state science standards.
- PACE program experienced facilities improvements and expansion and the addition of transition services for older students. In addition, PACE had a robust Professional Development program that brought in outside speakers.

- Support our staff with workshops trainings on Staff Well Being and Positive Social Communications.
- Continue to offer Cooperative Data Team ventures and interactions around topics of common core standards, instructional best practices)
- Develop a pilot process for licensed staff/administrator professional supervision and evaluation (aligning with H.B. 290)
- Increase safety and decrease restraints. With the addition of PBIS, a Behavior Specialist, Campus Behavior Monitors and additional administrative support, we anticipate overall improvements.
- Transition GED from paper-based testing to computer-based testing beginning January 2014.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT SERVICES

Department Overview

- The Instructional Services Department provides support and consultation services in curriculum and staff development as requested by the 20 component school districts. Services are designed to assist districts in meeting the requirements of school reform legislation.
- -The Professional Development Department provides training and support to school districts focused on school improvement related to Oregon's Education Act for the 21st Century, and supports school district sta in implementing professional development activities.
- -School Improvement Specialists provide leadership, support, and consultation in the area of school improvement, curriculum instruction, and assessment.
- -The ELL and Migrant program supports and collaborates with school di tricts to develop and implement ELL plans that are compliant with state and federal guidelines.



Top Accomplishments and Key Focus Areas

TOP ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2011-12

- Completed Common Core State Standards Navigation Tool for our Districts. The Tool assists teachers in the analysis of what is the same, what is different and what no longer will teachers do in terms of grade level standards. The tool can be found on our Effective Teaching Practices Web Site - (http://et.nwresd. org).
- Created Regional Prioritized Common Core Math and English Language Arts State Standards. The Prioritized Standards can be found on our Effective Teaching Practices Web Site - (http://et.nwresd.org).
- Assisted districts in their transition to the new Common Core State Standards.
- Completed the website http://diploma.nwresd.org that supports the implementation of Oregon's New Diploma requirements. The project was made possible with a grant from State Farm Insurance.

- Continue to support to component districts in:
 - Transitioning to the Common Core State Standards by:
 - Reviewing and revising their Continuous Improvement Plans (C.I.P.) by:
 - Meeting the measurement of student proficiency in the Common Core State Standards.
 - Implementation of Regional PBIS
- Continue our partnership with local universities by creating the courses for Continuing Licensure and Masters of Arts in Teaching Programs.

TECHNOLOGY DEPARTMENT

Department Overview

Services to Schools: The Technology Services Group (TSG), as a part of Cascade Technology Alliance (CTA), is responsible for the day-to-day computer services for school districts and ESD staff served by Columbia Gorge, Multnomah, Northwest Regional, and Willamette ESDs. Services include Internet connections, printing, network monitoring, file backup, and troubleshooting.

Software and Application Support: CTA provides software support to districts for student e-mail accounts, student and fiscal systems, list servers, domain name servers, home school tracking, web development, special education K-12 census tracking, testing services, class registration system, library ad textbook management, substitute management and employee absence tracking, online employee testing, background checking service, web-based surveys, and other system-wide data systems.

Information Services: CTA provides regional data processing systems to school districts in the areas of finance, human resource management, student information management and data warehouse systems.

Testing and Assessment: Testing documents received from school districts are scanned and scored, and the reports generated are distributed to district administrative staff.

Instructional Technology, Media and Videoconferencing: Provides teachers and district instructional staff on-demand access to current, curriculum-relevant

instructional videos via web streaming. Staff also consult and train regarding setting up technologically-based instructional systems. Videoconferencing scheduling and technical support are provided. Duplication services for district-produced media in DVD or VHS format is also available.



Top Accomplishments and Key Focus Areas

TOP ACCOMPLISHMENTS IN 2011-12

- Consolidated all NWRESD technology functions into the Cascade Technology alliance including:
- Created a single organizational chart.
- Implemented a single, common help desk ticketing system and reallocation of staff to more efficiently resolve tickets
- Cross-trained staff to support similar data systems, such as student information and fiscal systems.
- Implementation of a shared wide-area network with improved disaster recovery features.
- Developed and deployed an automated student registration system for home school students, with web-based access by parents and resident districts.
- Participated with the statewide Student Information System team in the selection of Edupoint Synergy Student Information System; began data migration Spring 2012.

- Continue implementing Edupoint Synergy Student Information System in multiple Cascade Technology Alliance school districts.
- Separate staff information from current nwresd.k12.or.us website, to create a new, internal site.
- Update external website.
- Expand Instructional Technology opportunities for districts.

ADMINISTRATION AND BOARD SERVICES

Top Accomplishments in 2011-12

- Continued to develop our shared services model to help districts free up resources for the classroom.
- Worked with legislators to rebuild positive awareness of and support for NWRESD.
- Collaborated with component district superintendents to evaluate and implement cost savings in the areas of business and human resource functions.
- Worked alongside our 20 component district superintendents to develop a 2012-13 Local Service Plan that will result in approval by their boards.
- Coordinated regular media contacts to share positive events and news within the agency.
- Mentored and assisted seven new component district superintendents.

KEY FOCUS AREAS FOR 2012-13

- Work with community, business, state leadership and legislators to enhance positive awareness of and support for NWRESD.
- Work with component district superintendents to evaluate and implement cost-savings in the areas of business and human resource functions.
- Develop and implement a 2012-13 Local Service Plan that will result in approval by our NWRESD component school boards.
- Mentor and assist our five new component district superintendents.
- Coordinate regular media contacts to share positive events and news within the agency.

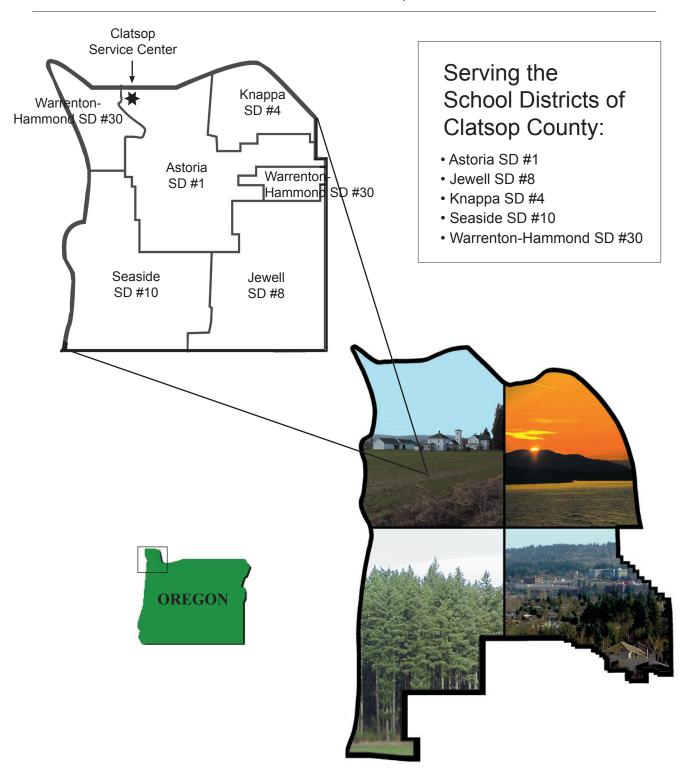

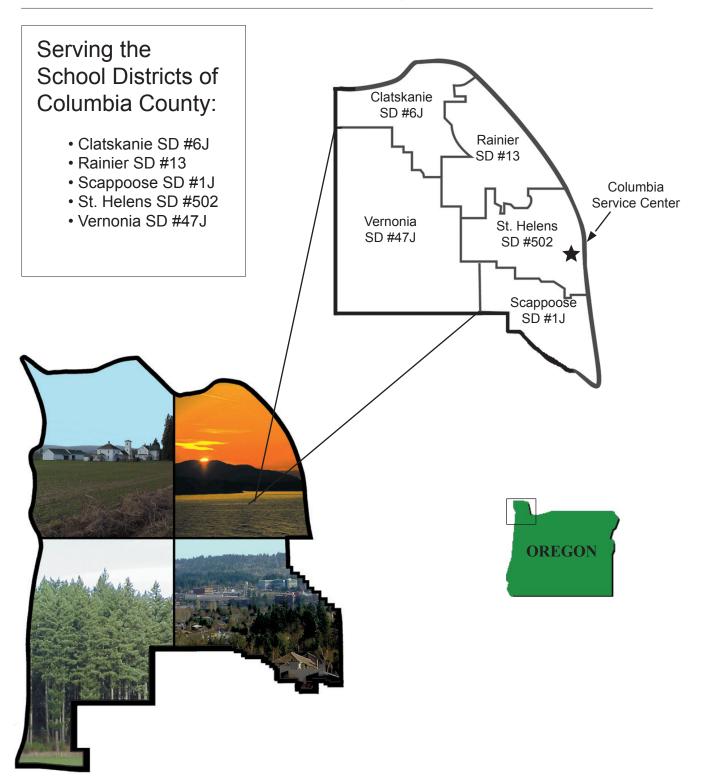

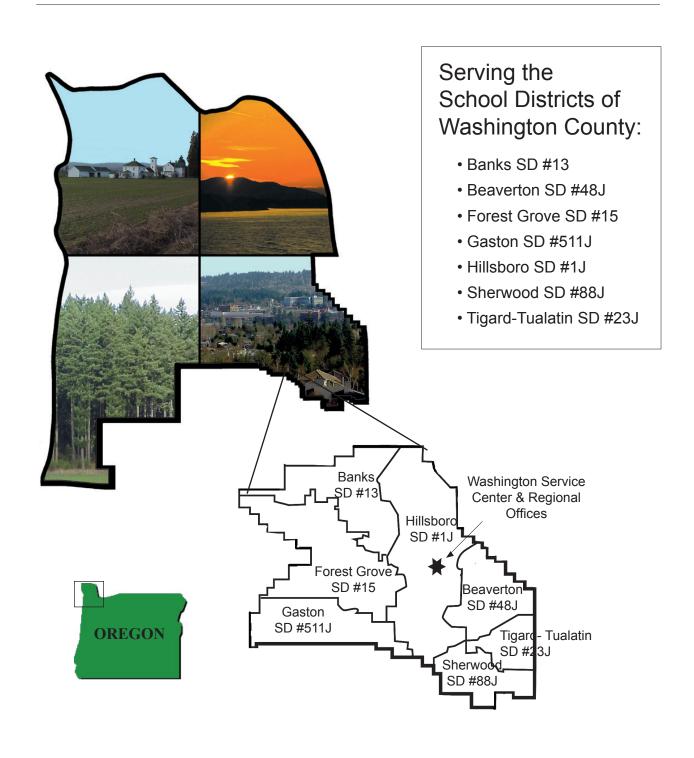
