Description of Proposed School Construction Project

Cambridge-Isanti Public School District, ISD #0911-01, is proposing a two-question bond referendum on November 4, 2025. The first ballot question would authorize \$87.1 million in bonding authority to finance districtwide facility improvement projects. The second ballot question would authorize \$36.475 million in bonding authority to finance a fieldhouse / gymnastics gymnasium addition to the high school and outdoor athletic facility upgrades.

For the first ballot question, proposed projects include: interior renovations, building system upgrades, security enhancements and site improvements at eight of the district's school facilities. The high school would also receive outdoor athletic facility upgrades, including: an artificial turf football field with other stadium upgrades, three new tennis courts, baseball and softball field upgrades, and related site improvements. Other district facilities, including Woodland, the Education Service Center and Transportation Center would receive minor security and/or building system upgrades. A few of the schools would receive building additions, including: a cafeteria / kitchen area, administrative offices / secure entrance, and restrooms at Isanti Primary School, a fitness center addition to Isanti Middle School and a 30' x 60' pickleball court with storage at the Adult Education Center.

The proposed projects would be scheduled for completion in calendar years 2026 through 2029. Project cost estimates for the first ballot question, by building / project component, are as follows:

The second ballot question is made up primarily of a fieldhouse / gymnastics gymnasium addition to the high school. The 71,300 square foot addition would house: four basketball courts surrounded by a running track, a gymnastic gymnasium area, team rooms, community rooms and administrative offices. Other proposed projects include: site improvements, additional parking areas and an expanded, specialized classroom addition at the high school to house art rooms that would be vacated by the fieldhouse / gymnastics gym addition.

The district currently has approximately 4,800 students currently enrolled in K-12 programming and is projecting a slight decline in enrollment over the next five years. The proposed building additions are expected to increase annual operating costs by about \$200,000. The proposed projects appear to be in the long-term interest of the district.

If the bond referendum is successful and bonds are sold, the debt service on the bonds will be eligible for debt service equalization under Minnesota Statutes, section 123B.53, subdivision 3, if the bond schedule is approved. The amount of debt service equalization aid, if any, the district receives is determined annually and is dependent upon property wealth, student population, and other statutory requirements.

Review and Comment Statement
