Newcomer: any student and their families who have recently arrived in the United States within the last two years and whose home language is not English.

The Community Engagement Office supports newcomer families in two key ways:

- 1. By supporting the Newcomer Arrival Protocol
- 2. By working with resettlement agencies

SUPPORTING THE NEWCOMER PROTOCOL

Family Interview: conducted by Parent Liaison and helps identify student and family needs

- Families receive a Community Resources Guide
- Needs are communicated to the Community Engagement Coordinator who follows up with a parent/guardian

SUPPORTING NEWCOMER FAMILIES

In-house Resources

- School Supplies
 - Sourced from the Back-to-School Resource Fair
 - Include backpacks and basic supplies (e.g., pencils, notebooks, folders, glue sticks, crayons, headphones, etc.)
- Caring Closet
 - Purchased with a McKinney-Vento grant made available through the Regional Office of Education
 - Include basic hygiene and clothing supplies (e.g., shampoo, body wash, toothbrushes, toothpaste, laundry soap, socks, leggings, etc.)
 - Translation devices also available



WORKING WITH RESETTLEMENT AGENCIES

Resettlement Agencies: Services include job assistance and housing programs that help with successful integration into a new community (e.g. World Relief, ICNA Relief, Exodus, Ethiopian Community Association of Chicago, etc.)

- Resettlement agencies often offer rental assistance; therefore, newcomer students are often McKinney-Vento eligible
 - Community Engagement Coordinator works with family case managers to combine resources available to the family
 - McKinney-Vento funds can be allocated for additional needs related to student school attendance
