Miner Academy students move in and out of the charter setting based on preferences and needs. Miner Academy, which offers primarily online learning, works fluidly with Bauxite High School and Bauxite Middle School in serving the needs of 6th through 12th grade students. Some students may want to take all of their classes through Miner Academy. Others may only take a couple of classes each semester. Students in grades 6-11 typically choose MA for elective classes and credit recovery as needed. Seniors who need a few credits to graduate choose MA for flexible scheduling.

We have a sub-group of students who are vital to Miner Academy - our Alternative Education students. These students are enrolled in Miner Academy for several reasons: 1) they might not necessarily be as productive as possible in the traditional high school setting and Miner Academy's individualized education program for students is more conducive; 2) they may have had social, academic, emotional, or behavioral issues that needed to be readdressed. Once they have been addressed, students are able to flourish in the Miner Academy environment. Students are able to work at a pace that suits them (with teacher guidance) and a flexible environment is extremely beneficial for the majority of our students; 3) students may need to complete credit recovery for a course they previously did not pass. Many students complete the course assigned to them and are able to get back on track with their credits. They are also able to continue working on existing courses and many of them are able to graduate early. Our scores do not necessarily take into account those students who complete courses early and are on track for accelerated graduation. 4) Many students at Miner Academy are labeled "at risk" students who are in danger of dropping out, not completing courses, may have family situations/issues, medical and or emotional needs, disciplinary problems, or do not excel in the traditional high school setting. Miner Academy provides an

outlet for these students. It provides a place for them to grow and thrive educationally. Many of these students need the Miner Academy environment to successfully succeed at high school.

Miner Academy's scores have fluctuated over the last five years. Students had structure and stability prior to the COVID pandemic. The structure of attending school, doing daily assignments, and having a network of support were drastically affected. Students need the structure and routine of being in school. With enrollment up at Bauxite, as well as surrounding districts, hopefully we have turned the corner and students will improve academically, as well as socially and emotionally.

The number of students Miner Academy is allowed to enroll was increased in 2019 from 150 to 200 students. This total is a combination of full-time Miner Academy students and part-time High School/Middle School students. The 45

students per classroom is set should we ever need to utilize a larger classroom space, such as a cafeteria. As of now, teachers have no more than 30 students (9-12 grades) per class and 28 students (6-8 grades). Teachers are able to help more students who have chosen independent/virtual learning.

If a teacher exceeds 45 students in a class, they will be referred for compensation. The district has allowed additional teachers and staff to be hired for Miner Academy so that class sizes are no more than 30 due to the actual size of the classroom. Having the availability to increase to 45 students should a larger room open, will help as enrollment increases.

We are currently limiting class sizes to no more than 30 students due to space. Should a larger classroom become available, a teacher may have up to 45 students in their class.

Bauxite Miner Academy Conversion Charter Renewal Application

Desegregation Analysis

The Bauxite School District (Bauxite) is submitting a renewal application for its conversion charter school, Miner Academy (school). As a district conversion charter school, the school may only enroll students who live within Bauxite's boundaries, or lawfully transfer into the district. Bauxite is contiguous to the following school districts: Benton; Bryant; Glen Rose; Harmony Grove (Saline County); Poyen, and Sheridan. This analysis is provided to inform the decision making of the charter authorizer regarding the effect, if any, that the renewal of Bauxite's district conversion charter would have on the efforts of Bauxite and the above-listed contiguous school districts to comply with court orders and statutory obligations to create and maintain a unitary system of desegregated public schools.

Bauxite, in this analysis, has carefully reviewed the potential impact that the renewal of its district conversion charter school would have upon its efforts and the efforts of the contiguous school districts to comply with court orders and statutory obligations to create and maintain a unitary system of desegregated public schools. In conducting its review, Bauxite has found that none of the contiguous school districts listed above are under any court orders concerning their desegregation obligations, and are therefore unitary in all respects of their school operations. Bauxite itself is not under any court order concerning its desegregation obligations.

According to last school year's third-quarter average daily membership enrollment figures as maintained by the DESE Data Center, Benton had a student population of 5,638 students, of whom 74.86% were Caucasian; 9.86% were Hispanic, and 9.4% were African-American. Bryant had a student population of 9,394 students, of whom 59.68% were Caucasian; 19.11% were African-American, and 16.14% were Hispanic. Glen Rose had a student population of 948 students, of whom 91.37% were Caucasian and 3.68% were Hispanic. Harmony Grove had a student population of 1,234 students, of whom 89.74% were Caucasian and 4.44% were Hispanic. Poyen had a student population of 496 students, of whom 93.13% were Caucasian and 3.64% were Hispanic. Sheridan had a student population of 4,152 students, of whom 86.78% were Caucasian and 6.28% were Hispanic. Bauxite's student population was 1,589 students, of whom 90.52% were Caucasian and 4.71% were Hispanic. Ark. Code Ann.

§6-23-106 also requires that Bauxite's continued operation of the charter school will not serve to hamper, delay or in any manner negatively affect the desegregation efforts of a public school district or districts within the state. Bauxite's careful review of the relevant statutes affecting the contiguous school districts, and the student populations of such districts, shows that such negative effect is not present here.

In conclusion, Bauxite submits that upon the basis of its review, no statutory or other impediments concerning the creation and operation of desegregated public schools prohibit the State's charter school authorizer from granting its application to renew its district conversion charter for Miner Academy.
