STUDENT TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

Transportation of students in MESD programs is, as a general rule, the responsibility of the student's resident district. Arrangements for transportation of each student ~~will~~ shall be made at the time the student is accepted into an MESD program.

School buses carrying students ~~will~~ shall be considered extensions of the school experience. All students using school transportation ~~will~~ shall abide by the code of conduct which is posted in each school or activity vehicle. Violations of the code, as well as other conduct which is improper or which jeopardizes the safety of self or others, ~~will~~ shall be reported by the school bus driver to the supervisor. The supervisor ~~will~~ shall, as soon as possible, inform the appropriate principal of such occurrence. Violators may be denied use of transportation for a period of time as deemed proper by the principal or supervisor.

When transporting students to participate in MESD-sponsored functions, such as field trips, MESD shall arrange for publicly-owned vehicles which meet or exceed all standards applicable under state rules and regulations, including, but not limited to, child safety system requirements as set forth in ORS 811.210, 815.055 and 815.080 and OAR 735-102-0010.
