




## How Have Relative Placements Changed From Fall to Winter?





- We have noticed in our data...
  - Largest growth area was students below grade level (37% to 24% in reading, 33% to 18% in math)
  - 67% of our population is 1 or more grade level below in math and 72% are 1 or more below in reading
  - Our on grade level or above increased from 16% to 27% in reading and 10% to 22% in math
  - We see more growth from students below grade level than at/above for both subjects
- We are responding to our data in the following ways...
  - Differentiation focus to reach all students on the diamond (institute and PD opportunities)
  - School Improvement Team created Student Engagement Questionnaire
  - Developing a tool to measure student engagement in the classroom (identified as an area for improvement) for administration/classroom teacher PD meetings.
  - Identifying students at both ends of diamond and increasing targeted small group instruction in both reading and math

- We have noticed in our data...
  - On target growth for both grade levels; however, 7th grade math slightly lowerbreakdown by domains
  - In 7th grade math, decreased percentage of students who were 2 or more grade levels below from 51% to 44%. In 8th grade math, decreased percentage of students who were 2 or more grade levels below from 63% to 57%.
  - Decrease in referrals from Quarter 1 to Quarter 2

- We are responding to our data in the following ways...
  - Implemented i-Ready online lessons on Thursdays through Second Step and rotation of content areas to dedicate 25 mins of class time to online lessons.
  - Data Dive at SIP day in January- PLC's focused on areas of need with continuation at Institute Day in February.




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

October, 2021 - August, 2022	Partner engages in year one of the Postsecondary Leadership Series for district and school leaders (ISBE covers full cost).
August, 2022 - Fall, 2023	Partner continues in year two of the Postsecondary Leadership Series for district and school leaders (ISBE covers fll cost).
Fall, 2023 - June 2024	Partner, <b>if they so choose</b> , continues in year three of the Postsecondary Leadership Series for district and school leaders (District covers 50% of costs).
