Presentations/ Recognitions

The Texas Middle Schools Association recently named Denton Independent School District's McMath Middle School as one of just seven Texas Schools to Watch for 2015-16, bestowing the prestigious honor for the school's academic excellence. Schools in the program are selected to serve as exemplars for other middle schools across the state and nation. As a member of the Texas Schools to Watch list, McMath will be used to teach academic best practices to other middle schools and school administrators and teachers will visit Washington D.C. to share information about their campus and practices at the National Schools to Watch Conference in June.

Denton ISD students accounted for 36 top-10 finishes and Denton High School a seventh-place team showing at the 34th annual Texas State German Contest that was held at Texas State University in San Marcos in February. The Texas State German Contest brings hundreds of students from across the state in a variety of academic and cultural categories highlighting the German language and culture. Dwight Goodwin, Director of Instructional Technology provided the Board with an update regarding the planning progress of the upcoming 2015 Lone Star TIA (Technology In Action) conference hosted by Denton ISD. The purpose of TIA is to provide Denton ISD staff with quality professional development that focuses on integrating technology into the learning environment so that our students are ready for 21st century success. To provide our community (residents, business professionals, community members, etc....) with quality professional development that focuses on technology, social media, and productivity tools. To provide outside-of-district educators with a low cost, quality professional development opportunity that features many of the large conference amenities (vendors, hands on workshops, certifications, etc....) and to showcase Denton ISD as a leader of learning and promote the positive initiatives happening within our district. Lone Star TIA is currently a self-funded event (via participant registration, vendor sponsorships, and donations).

Continued Discussion of 2016-2017 Budget Debbie Monschke, Assistant Superintendent of Business and Operations, reviewed the Progress for building the budget and consider requests by campuses and departments for the 2016-2017 school year. Ms. Monschke outlined the additional expenses that were accounted for in this budget that are associated with opening new campuses. She stated that next year's budget will be built based on property values of \$750 million, an

enrollment of 27,297 and an average daily attendance of 96 percent (26,205).

TASB Policy Update 104 and Local Policies Update 104 represents the second of two post-legislative updates, focusing primarily on amendments to the Administrative Code as a result of recent legislation. Update 104 is considerably smaller than Update 103, which included the bulk of the changes from the 84th Legislative Session. Major topics in Update 104 include taxes, financial reports and audits, reports to SBEC, video and audio recording in special education settings, partial credit requirements for students who are homeless or in foster care, credit-by-exam requirements for homeless students, substitutes for state assessments, and wellness policy requirements. Several of the local policy recommendations address new local policy requirements included in the 2015–16 TEA Student Attendance Accounting Handbook, including homebound instruction and residency and admissions. Other local policy recommendations address equal educational opportunities for students and student discrimination and harassment.

PEIMS (Public Education Information Management System) Audit The purpose of this report is to provide the board an update of the findings of the internal PEIMS audit, provided by DRV Educational Solutions. The audit was conducted in response to the need for increased PEIMS data accuracy and how that data accuracy relates to the potential for increased revenue opportunities. The consultants interviewed department heads from Business, Career and Technical Education, Curriculum and Instruction, Data Processing, and Support Services and conducted audits on seven campuses

Texas Teacher Evaluation and Support System (T-TESS) Teacher Sessions Overview Tracy Johnson, coordinator of human resources, shared the plan for the district's implementation of the Texas teacher Evaluation and Support System (T-TESS). Beginning next fall, Region 11 ESC will provide training and support for district appraisers at no charge. Teachers will receive training during in-service week this August. Curriculum and Instruction, Academic Programs, and Human Resources are collaborating on training, support, and systems required for implementation with minimal cost.

Moving forward area superintendents and the human resources' team will partner together to ensure implementation with fidelity across the district; to maximize campus leaders' time to support valuable coaching and goal-setting between appraisers and teachers; to build upon coaching skills of campus leaders/appraisers; and to provide opportunities for leaders to take part in "calibration walkthroughs" to ensure a common understanding of

instructional expectations outlined in the T-TESS Rubric.
