

Denton ISD funded all of the projects within the current tax rate.





The population of North Texas is larger than 38 states.

Denton ISD is second in home closings in the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex.

North Texas grows by one person every 3.3 minutes; 18 people an hour; 429 people per day; 3,015 people per week.

Since this year's senior class started kindergarten in 2010, Denton ISD's student population has ballooned by 40 percent.

2023 BOND - CITIZENS' ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Citizens' Advisory Committee was comprised of nearly 100 community representatives

The committee reviewed:

- fiscal & debt management history
- district needs relating to growth projections
- building age/life span
- safety conditions
- evolving educational deliveries/technology
- program needs/student opportunity

The committee met six times over a five-month period and made a recommendation to the Board of Trustees on Jan. 10, 2023.

2023 BOND FACILITY UPGRADES

- 15 campuses will receive a Child Nutrition/cafeteria upgrade
- 28 campuses and or facilities will receive a HVAC upgrade
- 33 security vestibule upgrades will be added to campuses district-wide
- 16 campuses will receive playground equipment replacement
- 12 campuses will receive fine arts improvements

- 14 campuses will receive roof replacements
- 8 middle schools will receive practice field turf and all-weather tracks
- 12 campuses and or facilities will receive an interior refresh (20+ years)



FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY

For 20 consecutive years, Denton ISD has achieved the highest possible rating in the school Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST), the financial accountability system established by the Texas Education Agency (TEA).

Senior citizens **65 and older** will not be impacted, as their **taxes are frozen.**

Current and projected property value **growth** within the district allows the district **to fund the proposed projects.**

Since Denton ISD's last bond election in May 2018, the **district has decreased the tax rate** by \$0.195 cents.

Denton ISD will fund all of the proposed projects with the current tax
